Live freely, remembering the Infinite

Pondering the Infinite (limitless ultimate Reality) which does not have a beginning or end can evoke a variety of ideas and some useful insights. Our universe was produced about 14 billion years ago from a spontaneous vibration emanated from the expressive field of ultimate Reality (not 'out of nothing' because matter cannot be produced from nothing).

Our planet is estimated to be 4 billion years old. Some of our ancestors who used stone tools lived two million years ago; others who seemed to be more evolved and had a larger brain lived 200,000 years ago. Modern human beings are currently in the early stages of intellectual and spiritual development, which is perhaps why we should be patient in our endeavors to encourage them to examine higher realities and be sincerely interested in nurturing spiritual growth.

Living freely and enjoyably is an attractive ideal or aim because we all want to be creatively productive and happy. At a deeper level, we also want to be spiritually conscious even when we are not able to explain what it means to be like that.

Our innate urge to know our pure essence and ultimate Reality as it is (not as it may mistakenly be presumed to be) inclines all souls (units of the pure essence of ultimate Reality) to want to have their awareness restored to its original, pure wholeness. Some people may seek an understanding of a higher power or larger reality because they are emotionally immature, want the care or protection of a cosmic parent-figure, or are not comfortable with thoughts of old age and eventual death.

The most impelling influence that makes us want to be spiritually aware is our innate urge to be spiritually enlightened (fully conscious with flawless awareness and knowledge of our true nature and ultimate Reality).

Overcoming the habit of Self- and God-forgetfulness

Just as new souls may temporarily forget their true nature and relationship with the Infinite by being too identified with objective circumstances and the inertia in nature which dulls awareness, they often continue to do it when they incarnate in causal, astral, or physical realms. When we are not constantly Self-aware, we may be inclined to be Self- and God-forgetful by allowing our attention to be easily distracted or preoccupied with random thoughts, moods, and objective conditions.

Our awareness, which reflects perceptions to our mind and intellect, follows our attention. That is why it is important for us to control our attention by being alert and intentional. It is common to hear some people say that they cannot concentrate, think clearly, control their emotions, or avoid being attracted to stimulating events or disturbed by troublesome events they hear about or observe. Mastery of attention is essential for effective living and for nurturing spiritual growth.

Spiritual values

LUCIS TRUST

At the heart of all psychological and spiritual growth is an evolution into right relations characterized by higher spiritual values; right relationships by definition are governed by a blueprint of spiritual values. Everyone recognizes higher values. Even though there is currently little to no widespread or formal training about values in education, most adults are able to easily identify them.

One might hypothesize this is so because the great spiritual teachers—Christ, Buddha, Lao Tzu, etc. demonstrated those values with their lives and left deep imprints on the human psyche. That is true. It also may be true that these values are embedded at the heart of the human soul and that spiritual Teachers are simply able to express fully what is already innately present. Spiritual values are often recognized as aspirational goals. Right relationship between individuals, nations, and kingdoms of life on the planet are only possible through a lived expression of spiritual values. This should tell us something significant—spiritual values are innate living energies which when fully embodied and expressed create right relationship.

All evidence points to humanity evolving towards a fuller alive expression of spiritual values. Gandhi pointed the way to achieve this evolutional transformation: "be the change you want to see", he stated. Paradoxically, it is the striving of each individual to live from those spiritual values that results in humanity as a group moving towards a culture that is a more accurate reflection of spiritual values. It is the soul in each of us that demands relief from the friction, chaos, and conflict engendered by lower regressive values—selfishness, separatism, greed, and the like. The soul aspires simply to be what it already is—love, wisdom, light, selfless service and goodwill in action, unity, harmony, and sacrifice—and to be liberated from all that obstructs and hinders its fullness of being. Suffering, in this context, is merely the intuition of wrong relations based on wrong values.

Triangles are a specific configuration or pattern recognized by both the fields of mathematics and architecture as being a more stable structure and by psychology as being a potentially difficult entrenched pattern. Psychology recognizes the potential destructive power of triangulation when there is a lack of transparency and equality (wrong relations) within the triangle such as occurs when the alignment between two points exclude the third. Triangles, therefore, can help to bring power, stability and right relations when used through higher values.

When triangles are created with the higher aspirational goals and spiritual values that are embodied in the Great Invocation, a model for right relationship based on selfless love and the united aspiration of the soul is created. The use of Triangles is, therefore, a way to "be the change you want to see" and help create right relations through embodying spiritual values on earth.

The activities of the Lucis Trust promote the education of the human mind towards recognition and practice of the spiritual principles and values upon which a stable and interdependent world society may be based.

Why Put God First?

SWAMI KRIYANANDA

The idea of putting God first is the very thought that both the new devotee and the worldly person find most difficult to accept. Having rooted their thinking in common sense, they assume that they've got to think first in practical terms, and then expand that into working spiritually with prayer and God's grace. But I've found in my life that if you really give what you're doing to God, somehow God will then supply the guidance that's needed, or bring the right people who can help you.

Paramhansa Yogananda demonstrated this principle in a story in Autobiography of a Yogi. He was a college student in Calcutta and had to take an exam for which he had not studied. He had attended only a few classes because he spent all of his free time with his Guru, Sri Yukteswar, in nearby Serampore. It seemed impossible for him to pass that exam because he knew practically nothing on the subject. But as he was walking across an empty lot on his way to the exam, he saw a piece of paper blowing along the ground. Hoping this was the divine assistance he needed to pass the exam, he picked up the paper and on it was just the information he needed. Again and again at Ananda I've seen in my own life and in the lives of others that when you put God first, then somehow everything works out beautifully. I don't mean that you should be impractical, but if you do your best, then God will take care of the results.

This principle also extends to being open to the assistance of others. One of the wonderful things about Ananda is that there's somebody who has expertise in just about any field you need. Even if you're in charge of something, it's ridiculous to keep up the pretense that you know everything about it. Always have the humility to be willing to say, "I don't know how to do this but here's somebody else who does." You'll be amazed at how many people there are in this world, not just in a spiritual community, who will come forward to help you. However, the most important thing of all is to keep in mind what your real priorities are. If you're a devotee, your real priority is finding God, not the work you're doing. I want to emphasize that point above all.

The story of Ananda has been a repeated coming back to our focus of who we really are. Repeatedly, there have been people coming in from the outside who were experts in their own fields who thought they were doing us a favor by advising us. Very often they've been right, but also they've been wrong. They were right from the standpoint of worldly success, but wrong in their definition of success.

As devotees, we want above all to serve God, and in our service we want to feel that even if we don't succeed in that service, we're growing closer to Him, that we're feeling Him more—His love, His joy. These are the important things. Then, secondarily, we want also to be practical.

When you take worldly success as you first priority and come at loving God from there, then you're coming to the center of the circle from the outside. The trouble with that approach is that there are lots of corridors that you can get sucked off into, and you can miss the center altogether. If you start at the center of living for God and expand outward from there, then God comes through, and things flow easily.

Throughout my life, as I've tried to feel and act on God's guidance, there's been a question in the back of my mind: Did I act in a certain way because I felt His guidance, or did He come in and save the day because I was simply trying my best? I think it's a little of both. But I've seen repeatedly that if I really gave what I was doing to Him with faith and with no ulterior motives, He has always saved the day, often at the last moment.

Faith is not just blind belief or groundless hope. It's something deep within, and you have to put all your energy into developing that faith. We have a song, Many Hands Make a Miracle, but to make the miracle those hands have to work hard together and also be practical. What I find is that miracles, if we want to call them that, are simply manifestations of faith. By being practical I mean you should take only one step beyond your actual experience, not giant leaps. You'll find that by taking that first



step, you'll gain enough understanding, energy, and insight to take the next step, and after that, the next step.

Eventually you'll be able to do those kinds of things which we consider the miracles of saints. It's not as if the saints had a special pipeline to God. They simply have put more energy, faith, and love into their spiritual practices. Miracles are done through God's power, yes, but also by God's power working through dedicated souls. Again and again at Ananda, although there have been people who wanted to do things in different ways — ways that weren't dependent on attunement with God — ultimately it has been seeking God that has made Ananda possible.

Toward the end of Paramhansa Yogananda's life, there were some people in the work who wanted to start getting organized. It wasn't that Yogananda was against organization, but he wanted whatever we did to be in tune. He didn't want to have an in-house rebellion saying, "Now we're going to get it organized in spite of him." One time I asked a senior disciple, who later left the path, "Why does Master keep taking things in different directions and not finishing them? Is he trying to teach us organization?" I was trying to understand. His answer was quite a shocker to me. He said, "Organization, hell! All he's ever done is disorganize." Yogananda was teaching us organization, but he was first teaching us to do things in attunement with God. Knowing that he wouldn't be around forever, he was also trying to get out many ideas so we'd know what to do when he was no longer with us. If he'd remained fixed in a single direction, we wouldn't have known what his ideas were in other areas. His method of organizing was absolutely perfect, but that disgruntled disciple couldn't understand it.

Don't let reasonable voices take you away from why you came onto the spiritual path and why you've come to Ananda. We've all come to seek God. If we can also provide an ambience where other people are inspired to seek God, that's wonderful, but don't allow secondary things to become first priorities. Seek the kingdom of God first, and these things will be added unto you.Don't start thinking, "Well, Yogananda didn't talk about this directly, and we've got to do something about it," and not try to tune in. If you don't try to tune in, what you do may be a good thing. It may even have a lot of magnetism, but it can also be that first step that leads you away from attunement with the Guru and the spiritual path.

We have to keep our ideals very strong, because we're swimming against the stream of worldly consciousness. We have to be absolutely clear about these ideals because we're surrounded by an entire culture that is dedicated to totally different ideals. Even religious people, by and large, are not seeking our kind of inner communion with God. There are so many wrong insights and attitudes toward life that you don't know where to begin to show people the way out. But the way we've begun at Ananda was the way Yogananda wanted—bringing people together who are strong in their attunement to God and Guru, and in what they're doing. From that strong center, it will spread.

As soon as you lose the thought of putting God first and being in tune with Yogananda, and begin to think in terms of other priorities, you begin to follow a road down which you can never stop going. The more you take that step toward dilution, the more you end up with a watered-down version of the spiritual path. The more you dilute coffee, the more it ceases to be coffee at all.

When you put God first, He'll find amazing ways of helping you. He may not spare you suffering. How would you grow if He did? But you'll find that His love and support will always be there for you. That's why Yogananda often said, "Devotees of this path will always be protected."

Path of the Masters

The above quote, from a previous Master of the Radha Soami Satsang Beas, beautifully illustrates a common misconception of many on the spiritual road. They believe that once they are ensconced on Sant Mat (the way of the saints), especially if they have a living Master or Guru, their passage through the material world becomes easier.

This is not necessarily so; the aspects of Pralabh, Kriyaman and Sinchit Karma (destiny, current and ancestral karma) still need to balance out. Thus the ups and downs (the splinters of the world) will continue to be present, hence the need for the 'strong shoes' of meditation on Shabd and spiritual practise.

Focusing on the Work, specifically that which is eternal and untouched by the illusion (avidja/maya) allows us to pass through times of transient hardship with equanimity. The ability to seemingly remain untouched by the slings and arrows of daily life is something that is often demonstrated by those in balance. People often, incorrectly take this as a sign that these blessed souls never have problems or hardships. The truth, of course, is that they are still subject to the foibles of daily vagaries but they have built up the necessary strength and focus to create 'strong shoes'.

In metaphysical work this is known as transmutation and is a vital tool for progression towards awareness of Sach Kand-the immutable All.

Beneficial suggestions in Vedas Part V

SWAMI MURUGESU MAHARISHI

Mantra 3 commentary continued.

Mantra 3: Let my mind, which is the basis for intelligence, action and beingness, which is the immortal light within beings, without which there is no action at all, think always beneficial thoughts. Which is the immortal light within beings.

It has already been explained that mind is made up of light material. We all know that even as there is a physical plane, there are other planes in the universe. Astral, mental and buddhic planes are mentioned in spiritual literature. The mental plane is made up of light. The Beings residing in that plane are described as devas in Hindu legends. Devas have light as their functioning medium. It is to be understood that human mind evolved from that cosmic light. As this divine mental light is not a transformation of anything but is self luminous, it never extinguishes. It is Immortal light. As our mind is an evaluate of that light, we can assume without any doubt that our mind light is also immortal, without which there is no action at all. Actions are performed through three organs — manasa, vacha, kaya (mind, speech and body). From the foregoing commentary, it will be clear that mind is the cause of all actions of body and speech. So, mind is the basis for all actions.

Mantra 4

Para-phrase: Let my mind, upon which the past, present and future immortal memory of the life process depends; by which yajnas of seven fold are performed think always beneficial thoughts.

Commentary

Upon which the immortal memory of past, present and future life process depends. For a very long time a question had arisen among inquirers who ask whether, after complete liberation from births and deaths, after attaining nirvana the soul has any memory of its past evolutionary experiences. Many cannot answer this because they have never experienced the nirvanic state during their life time. But a few seers and adepts do experience nirvanic pleasure during their lifetime. Those who do not attain nirvana during their lifetime will not attain it after death, but will return to physical life. In the nirvanic state we remember all the experiences we have undergone from our first lifetime until we attain full liberation. It is well-proven that, during his lifetime, man's subconscious mind (which is a part of the conscious mind), retains all the impressions of his past lives. This has been proven in deep hypnotism. Similarly, if one studies one's past and present karmas, one can predict one's future. Further, modern psychology has also proven that the future of a person depends upon his or her mental outlook. So, our mind retains all that has been past and all that is going to happen in future. It also shapes the present.

All yajnas, or sacrificial acts, contain seven parts or divisions. These seven acts of yajna are performed by mind. One of the acts is the rhythmic reciting of Veda mantras. Another involves the pouring of ghee into the sacrificial fire. While another requiresoffering specific ingredients to the sacrificial fire. Are these acts to be performed through mind? Mantras do not reside in the mind, yet without mind mantras cannot be chanted. So, the seven-fold acts of a Yajna are performed by mind only.

The psychology of spiritual success

It is often said that winners imbibe a 'psychology of success', and that it is this inner psychology that determines their level of achievement in the world. In the spiritual field one's dedication, devotion and love are seen as critical determinants on a sadhaka's path to success. Various obstacles and distractions appear on the sadhaka's journey and it is only the aspirant truly dedicated and devoted to reaching his goal who is ultimately successful in realizing the truth.

So, what is the expressed psychology of a successful aspirant? The first aspect that differentiates the successful sadhaka from the ordinary or non-achieving sadhaka is his or her attitude. The successful sadhaka lives in an 'attitude of gratitude' and realises within himself that all thing are created by God and rest in God. For this spiritual truth, the sadhaka realizes that he is forever indebted to God and the only way he can repay the 'immortal beloved' is through conscious realization of the inner spirit within himself. By following this attitude, the sadhaka is also effectively able to combat the false ego which is the natural enemy of spirit.

The second psychological trait of a sadhaka is his level of surrender. The successful sadhaka is always able to surrender himself to his guru and God. This uncompromising trait of surrender is what distinguishes a partially illumined sadhaka from a fully illumined sadhaka. The realized masters and gurus of the ages were fully surrendered to their gurus and to God. The did not reap the fruits of their actions and left all the fruit to God. This is what made them truly remarkable in their character and being.

The psychological trait of spiritual success is the sadhaka's conscious adoption of humility. This is when the sadhaka always sees or regards the next person as being 'bigger' than him. Another way of developing humility is to bow down mentally before the light in every person, even one's so-called enemies. This universal view of equanimity is encouraged in the *Bhagavad Gita* and can be accomplished by those who are humble and virtuous. After a while the conscious adoption of humility is not required as it becomes second nature to the sadhaka. The trait of humility also allows the sadhaka to combat ego which is always an alluring temptation for any sadhaka on the path, no matter how advanced the sadhaka is.

One of the most important traits of a successful sadhaka is his level of guru bhakti. This is linked to the trait of self-surrender and manifests itself as dedication to and love for the guru. The love is unconditional and spiritual in nature. Dedication involves being able to have the discipline to complete the required sadhanas and actions that the guru has prescribed. This trait will provide the sadhaka with a telepathic and spiritual link to the guru even after the guru has attained mahasamadhi.

My message to you this month, dear readers, is to try and cultivate the psychological traits of those successful yogis and aspirants who have come before us and lived lives of great sanctity and austerity. By inculcating these traits you will be led to a more sacred and purer space which will allow for rapid spiritual growth.

Gender equality – a Baha'i perspective

We are approaching the end of the Women's Month. This is an opportune time to reflect on the progress made towards empowerment of women, while looking ahead to overcoming the challenges that still remain. There has been significant improvement in the status of women and girls in the last few decades. Despite this, women are still frequently not treated as equals in their families or in society Conventional beliefs that women are inferior make them easy targets of anger and frustration. The well-being and happiness of our societies and mankind as a whole depends on the development of the potential virtues and abilities of every one of us, regardless of race, nationality, class, religion, or gender.

According to the Bahá'í Scriptures: "The world of humanity has two wings – one is women and the other men. Not until both wings are equally developed can the bird fly. Should one wing remain weak, flight is impossible" and "the happiness of mankind will be realized when women and men coordinate and advance equally, for each is the complement and helpmeet of the other".

The equality of men and women as an essential aspect of a broader principle: the oneness of humanity. In the context of the oneness of humanity, gender equality is not only a requirement of justice but it is a pre-requisite for peace and prosperity.

In the words of the Bahá'í International Community: "The principle of the oneness of humankind lies at the heart of the exhortation that we should treat others as we ourselves would wish to be treated. To establish justice, peace and order in an interdependent world, this principle must guide all interactions, including those between men and women. If the treatment of women were scrutinized in the light of this ethical standard, we would doubtless move beyond many traditional, religious and cultural practices".

Equality of men and women will bring about a more balanced world, a world in which the more masculine qualities of force and courage will be balanced by intuition, love and service; qualities in which women are strong. "Women and men," the Bahá'í Writings state, "have been and will always be equal in the sight of God". The rational soul has no gender, and whatever social inequities may have been dictated by the survival requirements of the past, they clearly cannot be justified at a time when humanity stands at the threshold of maturity.

In the Bahá'í view, "the equality of men and women is a facet of human reality and not just a condition to be achieved for the common good. That which makes human beings human—their inherent dignity and nobility—is neither male nor female. The search for meaning, for purpose, for community; the capacity to love, to create, to persevere, has no gender. Such an assertion has profound implications for the organization of every aspect of human society".

While women must develop their capacities and, in order to play an active role in all fields of human endeavour, the impact of their actions will be limited without the full cooperation of men. Partnership with men and boys is very important, because unless men refuse to accept laws and practices which discriminate against, and humiliate their daughters, sisters, wives, and mothers, the change will not be possible.

The change or transition required towards bringing about gender equality requires education and patience with oneself and others, as well as an unshakable determination.

The Bahá'í Faith is the youngest of the world's independent religions. Its founder, Bahá'u'lláh (1817-1892), is regarded by Bahá'ís as the most recent in the line of Messengers of God that stretches back beyond recorded time and that includes Abraham, Moses, Buddha, Krishna, Zoroaster, Christ and Muhammad.

Accepting illness to heal

If you view illness as an opportunity, then when you get sick, you can ask yourself, "Okay, what can I learn from this disease. What do I need to look at first?"

When I began working with the group *Exceptional Cancer Patients*, I noticed many of the group lived longer than their doctors expected. I wanted to know why. I began to observe and inquire and noticed that the long-term survivors were the ones who began to pay attention to their feelings. As they expressed their emotions, made wise choices and became more spiritual, their bodies benefited. The physical changes were the side effects of an altered life.

Physicians call the most dramatic healings 'spontaneous remissions'. Once we have labeled them, we learn nothing from the people in whom those remissions take place. We cannot afford to ignore these remarkable successes. We are all at risk for a great many diseases, and as the world gets smaller the list of things we are exposed to grows larger. We need to learn from people who recover and people who stay healthy.

In his novel *Cancer Ward*, Solzhenitsyn wrote of self-induced healing, which is a much better term than 'spontaneous remission'. Solzhenitsyn chose a rainbow-colored butterfly to symbolize healing. The butterfly represents change and the rainbow represents all of our feelings and emotions. We need to let the butterfly of change and emotional growth touch our lives if we are to heal.

One of the gloomy patients in *Cancer Ward* reacts to the talk of self-healing with this complaint: "I suppose for that you need to have a clear conscience". He is right. You do have to have a clear conscience. When you do the work necessary to clear your conscience, then the joy of living returns and the physiology of optimism restores you.

If you are ill or facing adversity, you can begin to heal yourself by following the paths others have followed. Forgive yourself and others, live with hope, faith and love and watch the results in your life and in the lives you touch. Remember that success and healing refer to what you do with your life, not to how long you avoid death.

What approach should you take to your illness? I have three words of advice: accept, retreat and surrender. Those three words might scare you if you were an inexperienced warrior going into battle, but others who have employed these tactics have won great victories.

You need to accept your situation if you want to be empowered to change it. I don't mean you need to accept any particular outcome of a disease, but you need to accept that the disease exists in your life and you are a participant. Once you accept that the disease or other misfortune has become a part of your life, you can marshal your forces to eliminate or alter it. If you avoid thinking about it, deny it or feel hopeless, you cannot play a part in changing it and your life.

Accepting the situation does not mean accepting someone else's prediction about what will happen to you. No one knows what your future will be. Do not accept that you must die in three weeks or six months because someone's statistics say you will. You are better off denying your illness completely than accepting a prediction that sounds like a death sentence. The best course, though, is accepting that you have problems while denying anyone's predictions about how your situation will turn out. Individuals are not statistics.

When I say 'retreat,' I don't mean withdrawing in the face of a more powerful opponent. For me a retreat means withdrawing to a quiet place where I can be aware of my thoughts and feelings. The quiet place may be anywhere; the source of true peace and quiet is inside me. In my retreat I withdraw from all the demands of life, but at the same time I am fully alive to myself and my loved ones. I do not always retreat alone. I can retreat with those who are close to me so that we can heal our forces and prepare to take on life when our retreat is over. When we return we are ready to fight for our lives. My



wife, Bobbie, and I regularly retreated when our five children were young. We needed the space and time to restore and heal ourselves.

When you have accepted, retreated and prepared yourself to fight, then you are ready to surrender. Again, you do not surrender to outcomes but to events. We waste so much energy fighting the nature of life. Accept the nature of life and surrender to it. When you do, you will have peace. When our energy is restored, we stop fighting things we cannot control, and we can start building our lives. Surrender is not about doing nothing; it is about doing the right things.

When you surrender to the illness, you continue to receive your treatments, explore your feelings, repair your relationships and do all the other work of healing. But while you are working, you are saying, "Thy will be done," and not "My will be done". Surrender the pain, fear and worries and you'll be able to keep love, hope and joy in your life. As the Serenity Prayer tells us, leave it to God and rest.
