Next she attended the University of Nebraska—Lincoln and earned a Master of Music degree in May 1999. She studied organ with George Ritchie and was a graduate teaching assistant in organ, accompanying and music history.

She studied organ with Marie-Louise Langlais at the Conservatoire Supérieur de Paris-CNR in Paris, France from 1999-2001 and was a prizewinner of the Conservatoire.

She served as assistant organist at St. George's Anglican Church in Paris.

In August 1999, she participated in the International Organ and Clavichord Improvisation academy in Smarano, Italy.

In March 2000, she was awarded third prize at the Sixth International Lorriane organ competition (superior division) in Freyming-Merlebach, France.

In March 2001, she was awarded first prize at the 71st International U.F.A.M. organ competition (superior division) in Antony, France.

She has played recitals in Kansas, Oklahoma, Nebraska, Texas, and France. She is a member of the American Guild of Organists, the Organ Historical Society, and Sigma Alpha Iota.
