Matthew 5:9. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God."

## **Lesson 1 - Conflict Provides Opportunities**

- 1.1 Key Principle: Conflict is an opportunity to...glorify God, restore a relationship, bring someone to repentance.
- 1.2 What is conflict?: A difference in opinion or purpose that frustrates someone's goals or desires.
- **1.3** The **Four G's** A God-centered response to conflict:
  - 1) Glorify God

**1 Corinthians 10:31** Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.

Ask yourself, "How can I please and honor God in this situation?" You can do so by:

Trusting (Proverbs 3:5-7)...Obeying (Matthew 5:16)...Imitating (Ephesians 5:1-2)

Acknowledging (Philippians 2:13)...

2) Get the log out of your eye

**Matthew 7:5** You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

Ask yourself, "How can I show Jesus' work in me by taking responsibility for my contribution to this conflict?"

3) Gently Restore

**Galatians 6:1** Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted.

Ask yourself, "How can I lovingly serve others by helping them take responsibility for their contribution to this conflict?"

4) Go and be reconciled


**Matthew 5:24** Leave your offering there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and present your offering.

Ask yourself, "How can I demonstrate the forgiveness of God and encourage a reasonable solution to this conflict?"

5) These four G's are encompassed in the **Foundational G**: **Gospel** of Christ

**1 Timothy 1:15** It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all.

Escape responses (peace faking)

- Denial
- Flight
- Suicide

Peacemaking responses

- Overlook (Prov 19:11)
- Reconciliation (Matt 5:23-24)
- Negotiation (Phil 2:3-4)
- Mediation (Matt 18:16)
- Arbitration (1 Cor 6:1-8)
- Accountability (Matt 18:17-20)

Attack responses (peace breaking)

- Assault
- Litigation
- Murder
