<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ends in -ar, -er, -ir• Not conjugated• Pronouns are attached• Reflexive pronouns must agree with subject	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Present tense• Certain to happen• 2 verbs in a sentence whereas the <u>subject</u> does not change• Don't attach any pronouns unless it is a positive command• Pronouns are placed before the conjugated verb	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not certain to happen• 2 different subjects whereas one of the subjects has <i>emotion, doubt, or desire</i> for another to carry out an action.• Take the "yo" present tense of the verb, drop the -O and add opposite endings

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| | | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Endings are: a, as, a, amos, áis, an & e, es, e, emos, éis, en• Don't stem change nosotros/vosotros. Only -IR stem-changing verbs change from e-i and o-u• Only add a pronoun to positive commands• Place pronouns before the subjunctive conjugation |
