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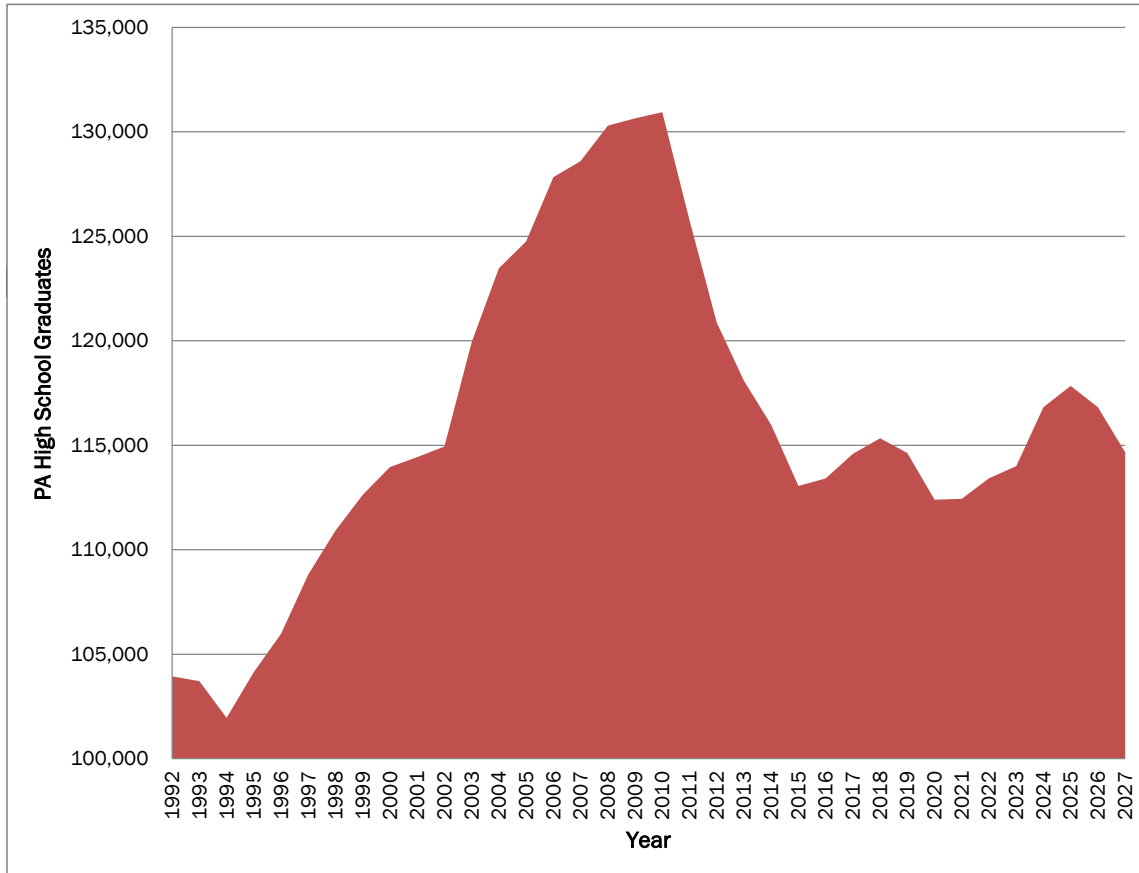

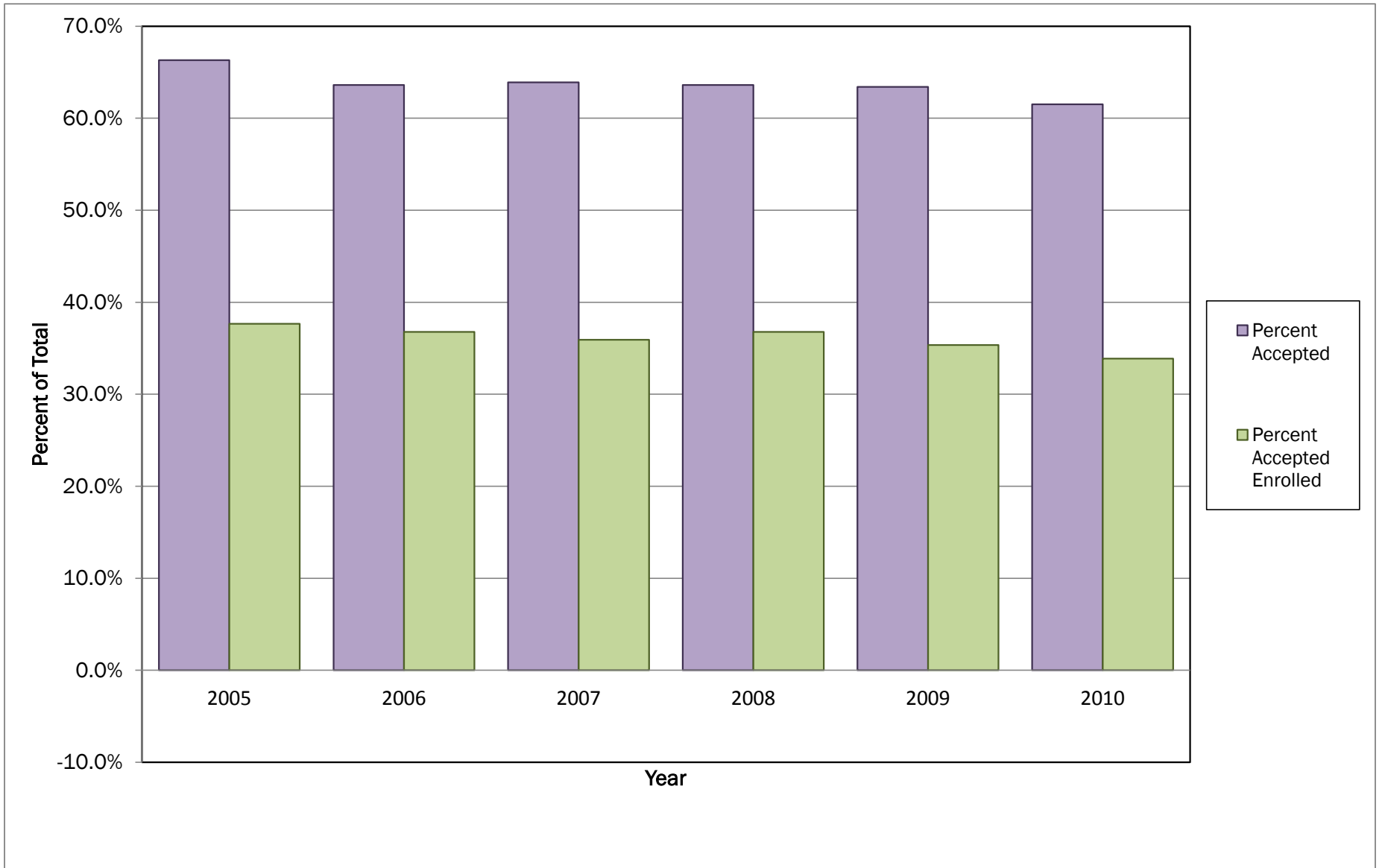

Figure 4: Percent of PASSHE Applicants Accepted vs. Percent of Accepted Enrolled, by Ethnicity, Fall 2010

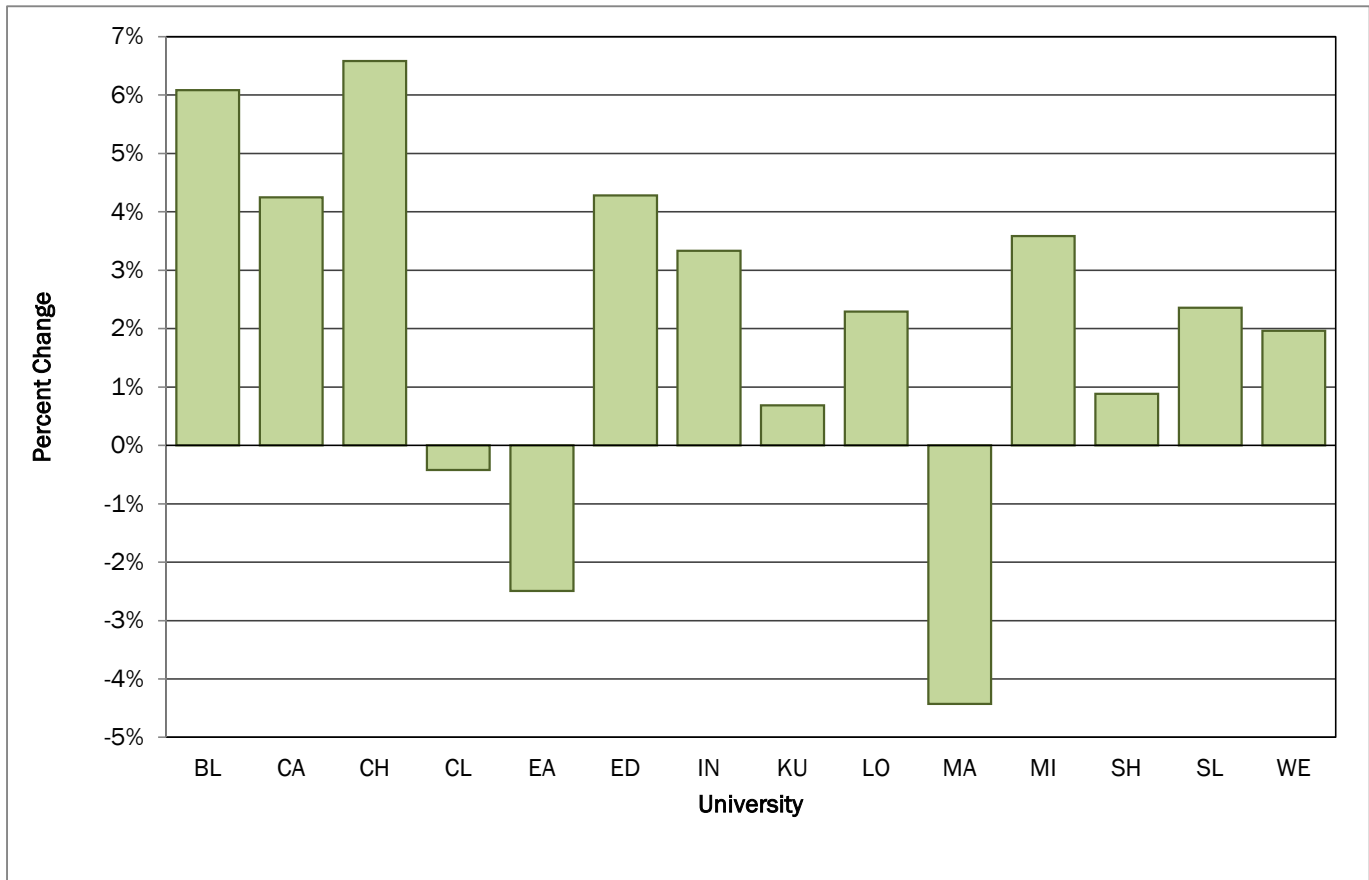

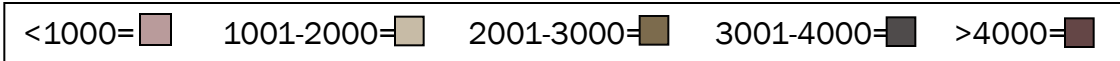
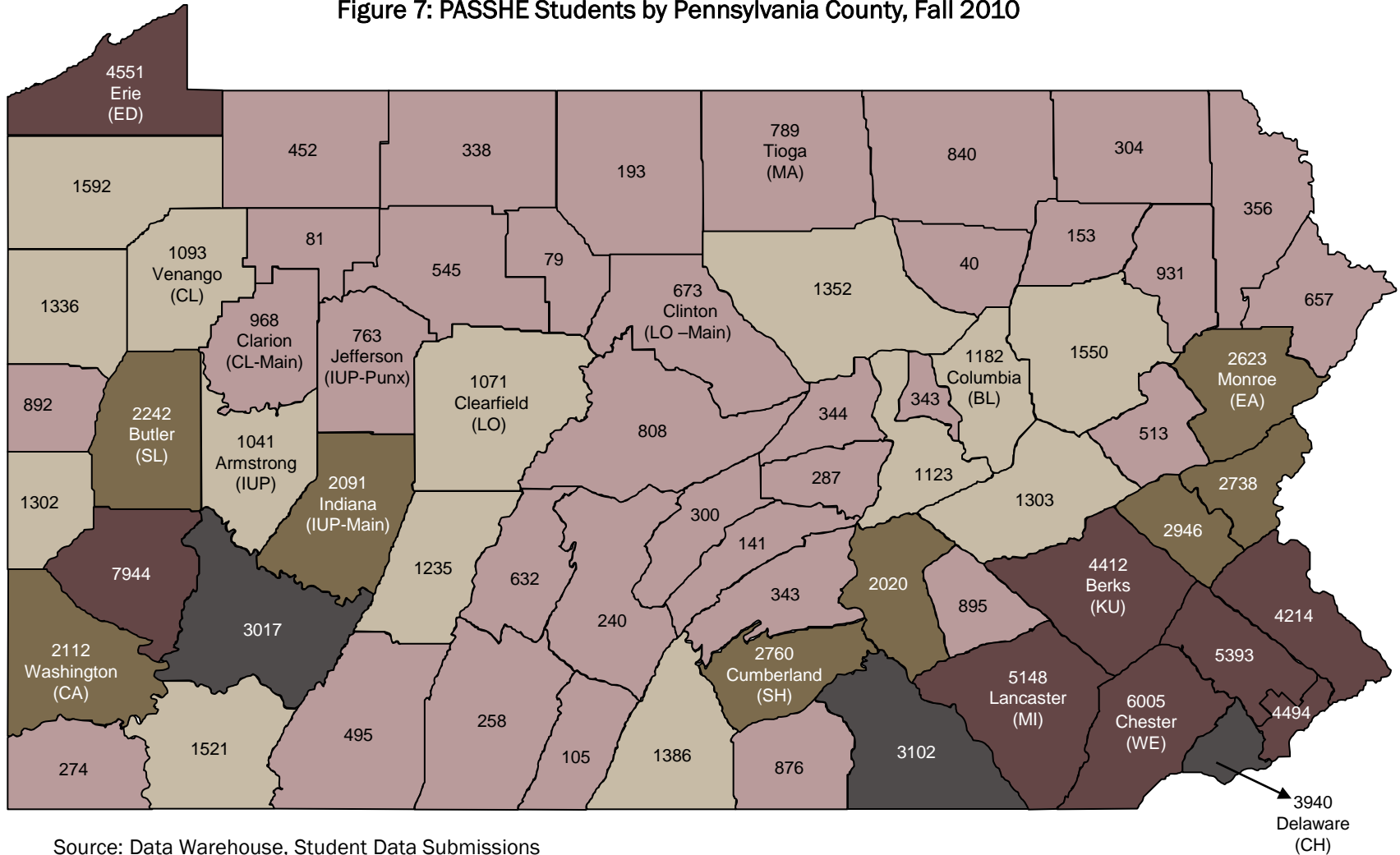

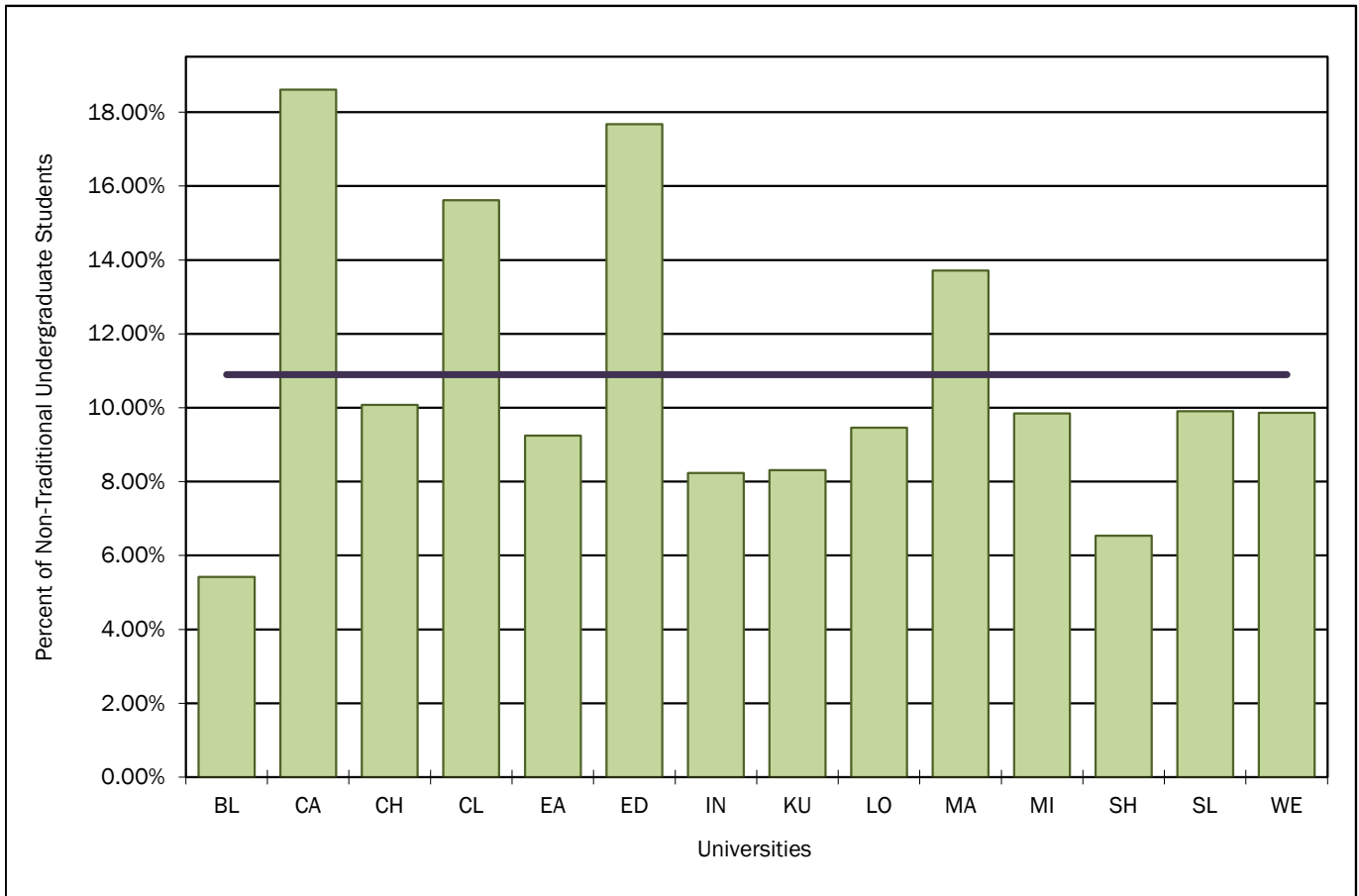

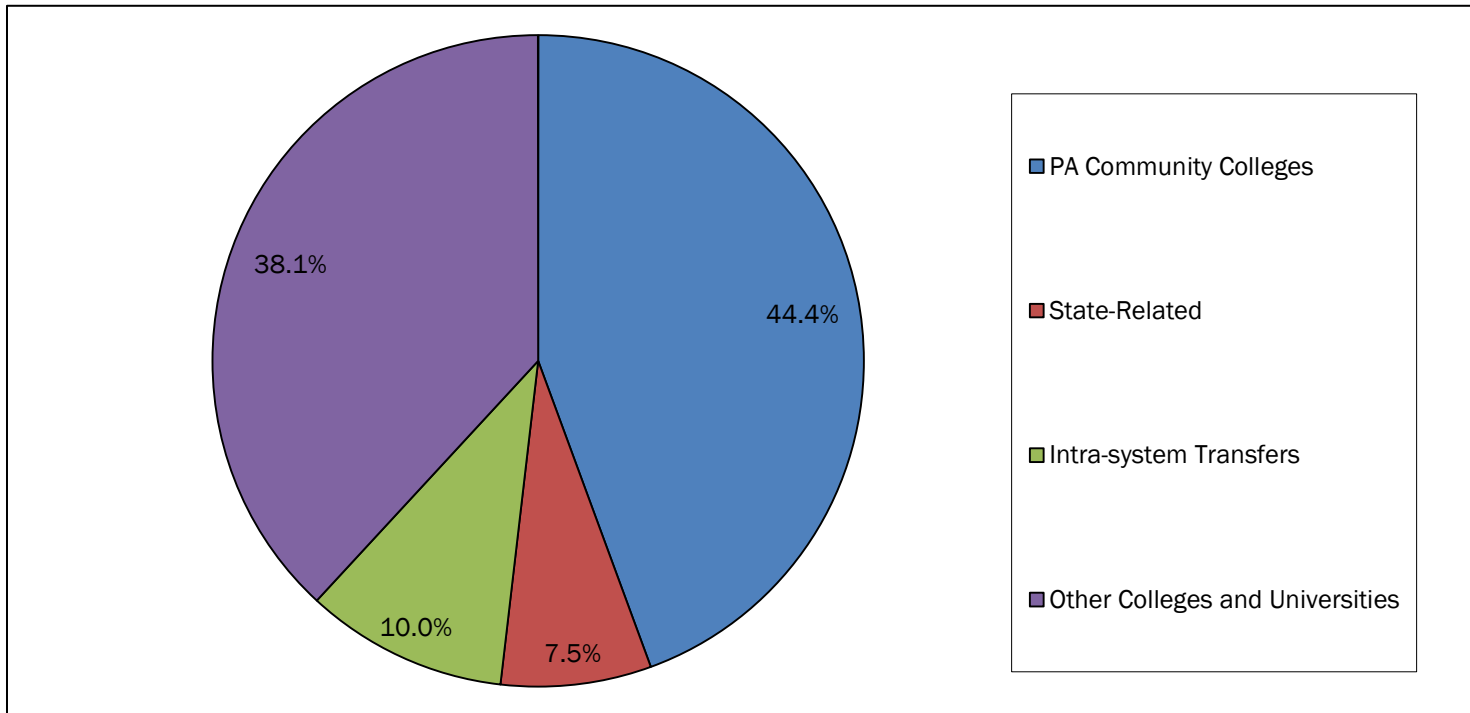

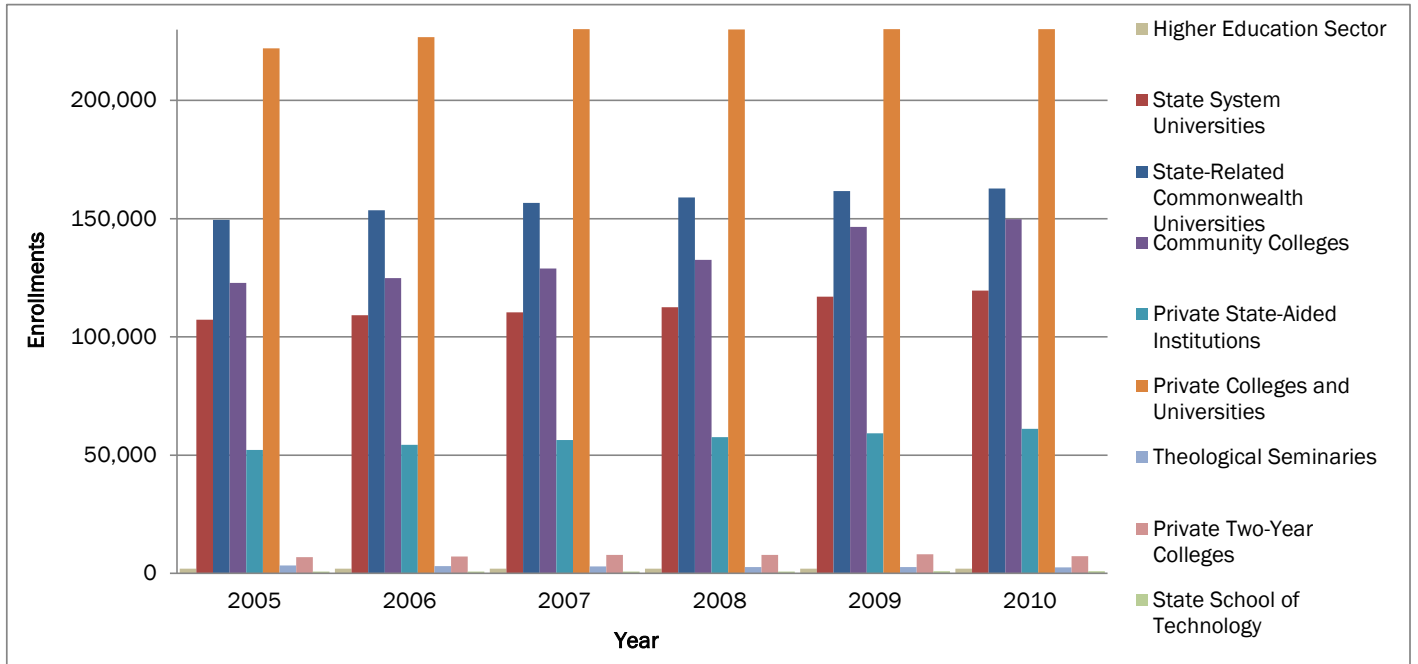

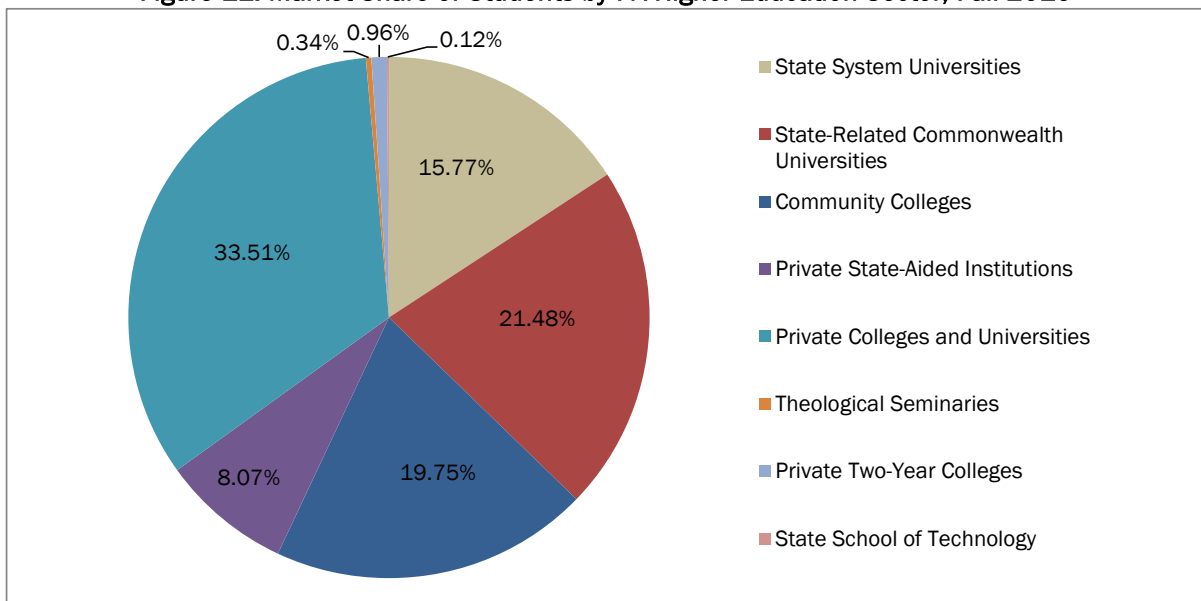

Figure 12: Comparison of PASSHE Graduate/Undergraduate and Resident/Non-Resident Tuition, 2000-01 to 2010-11

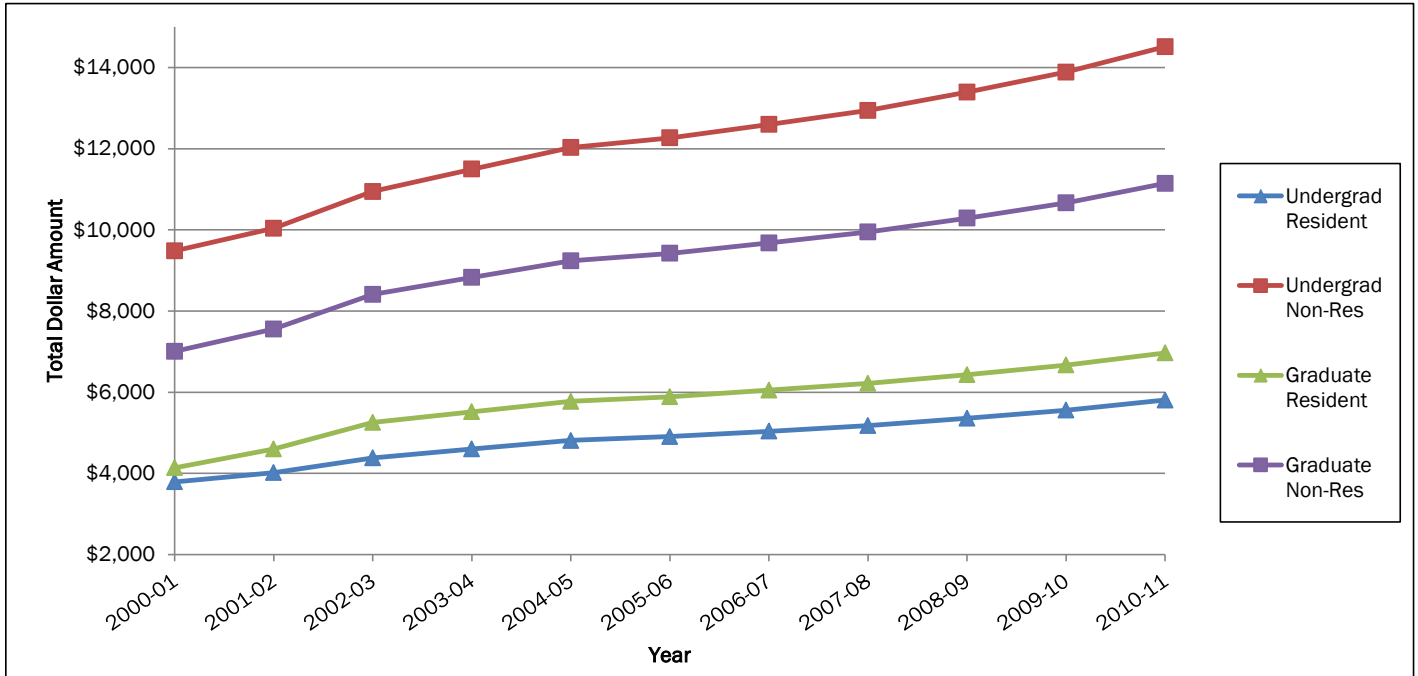
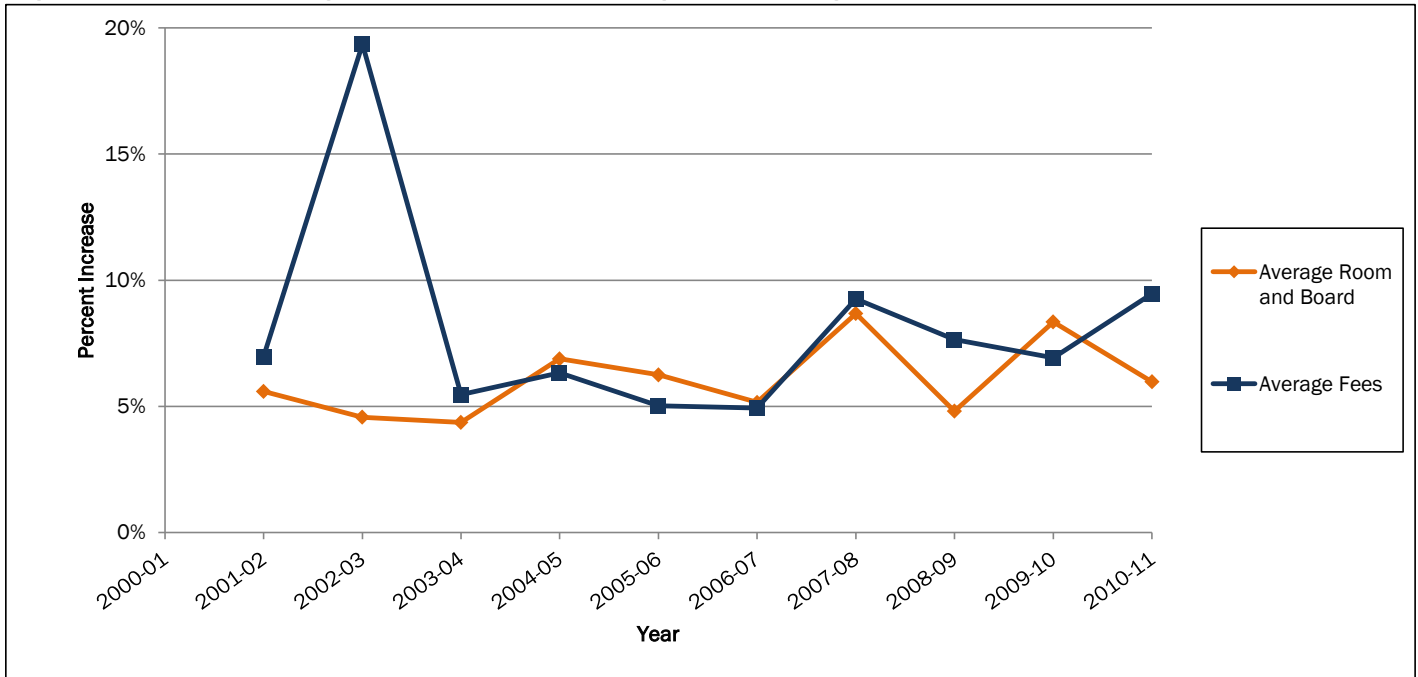


Figure 13: Annual Percentage Increase of PASSHE Undergraduate Average Room and Board and Fees, 2000-01 to 2010-11

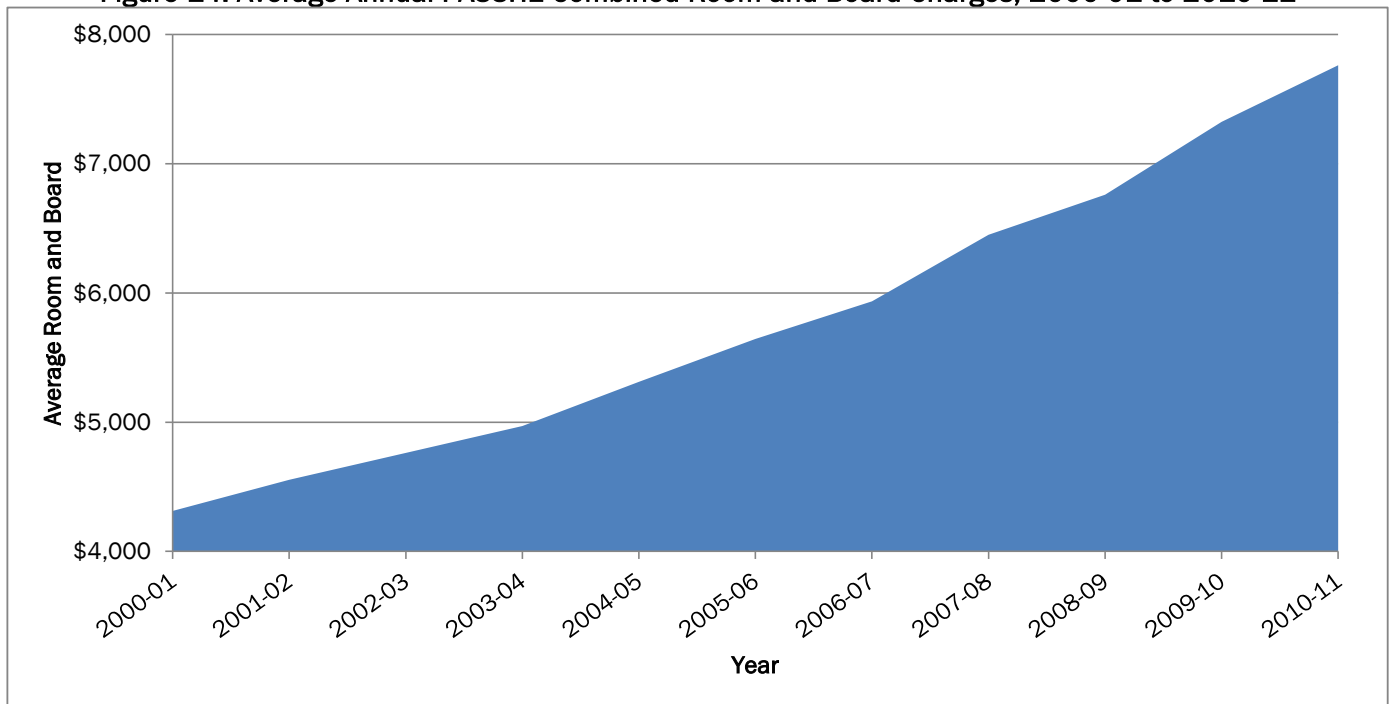

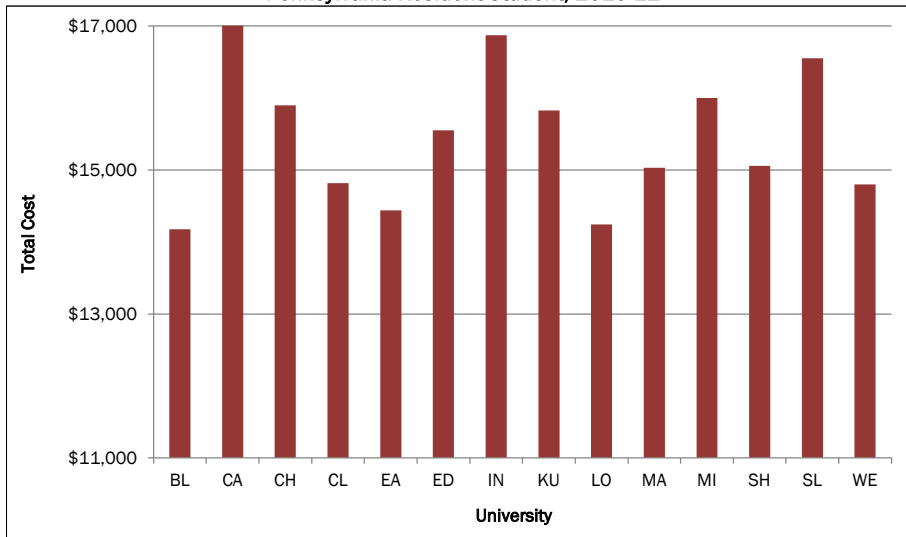

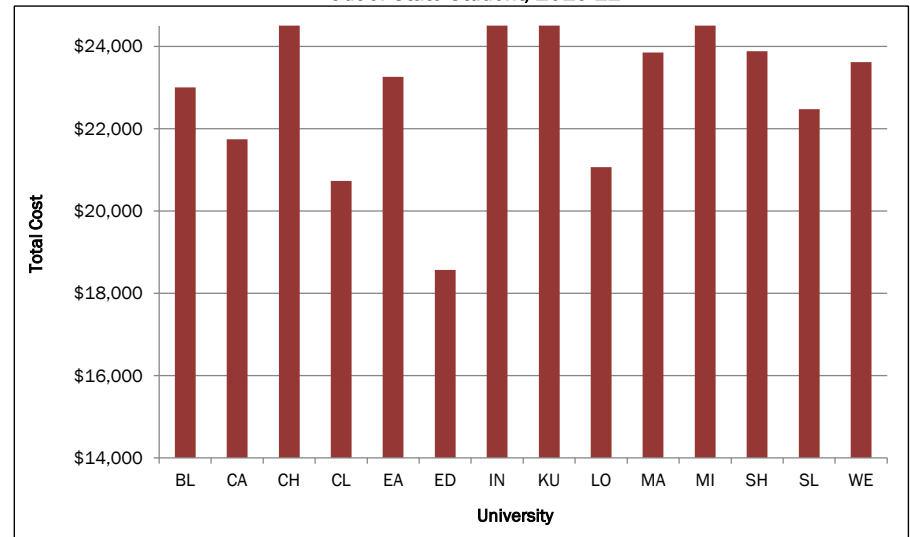

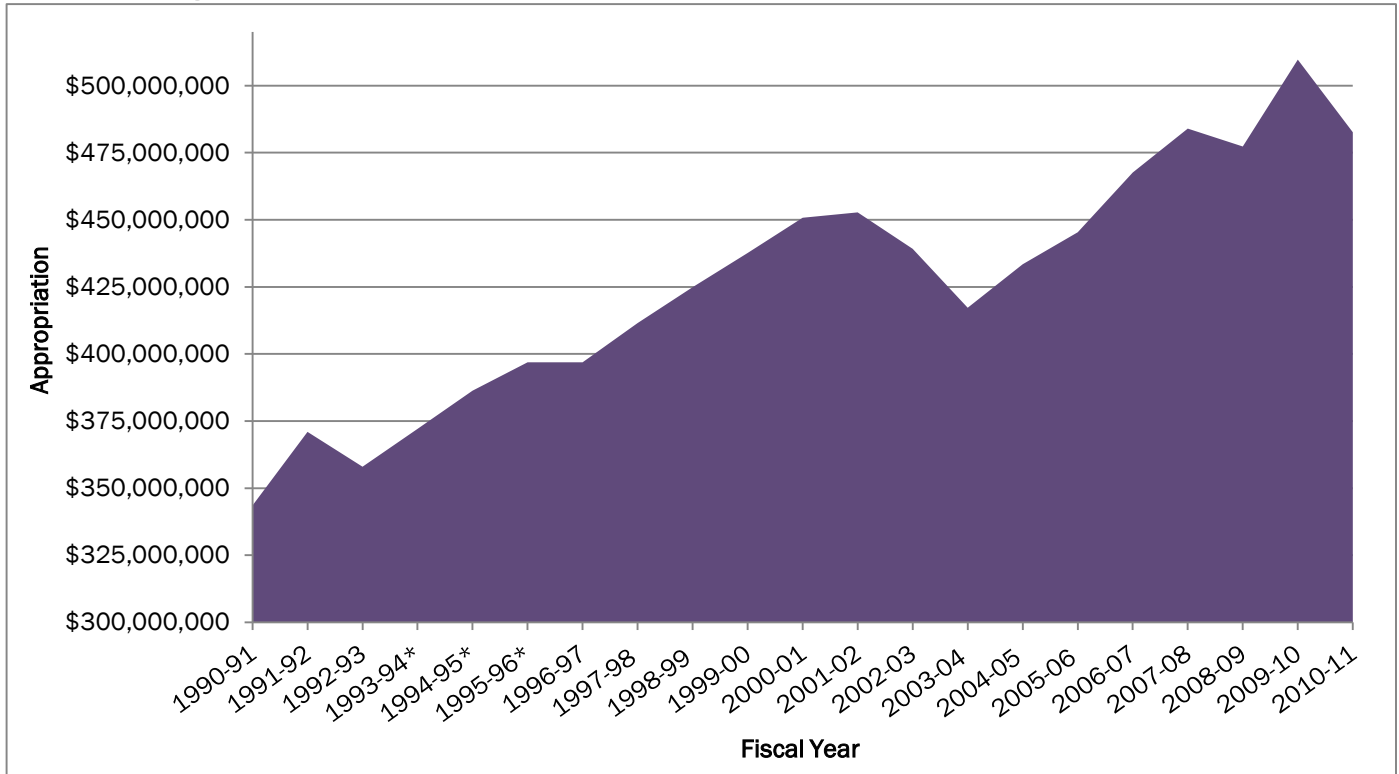

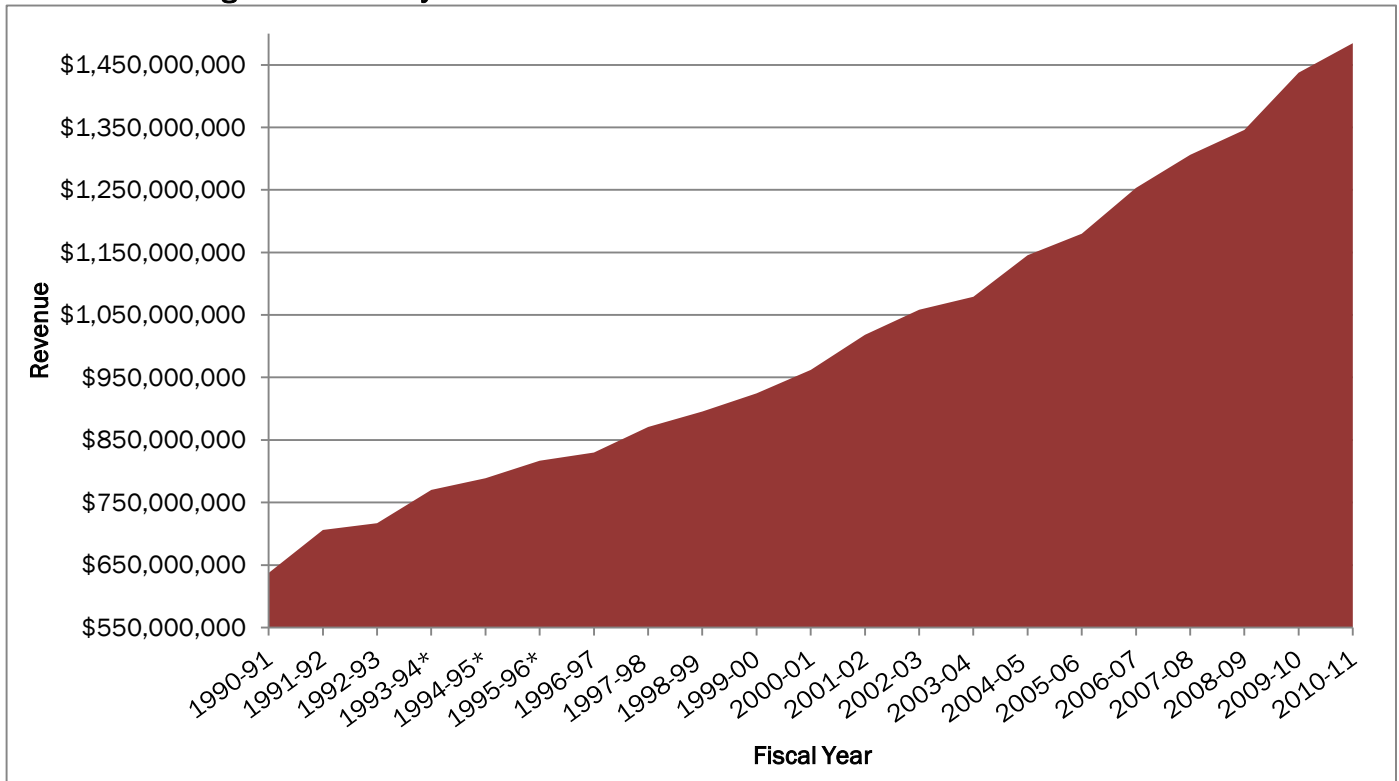

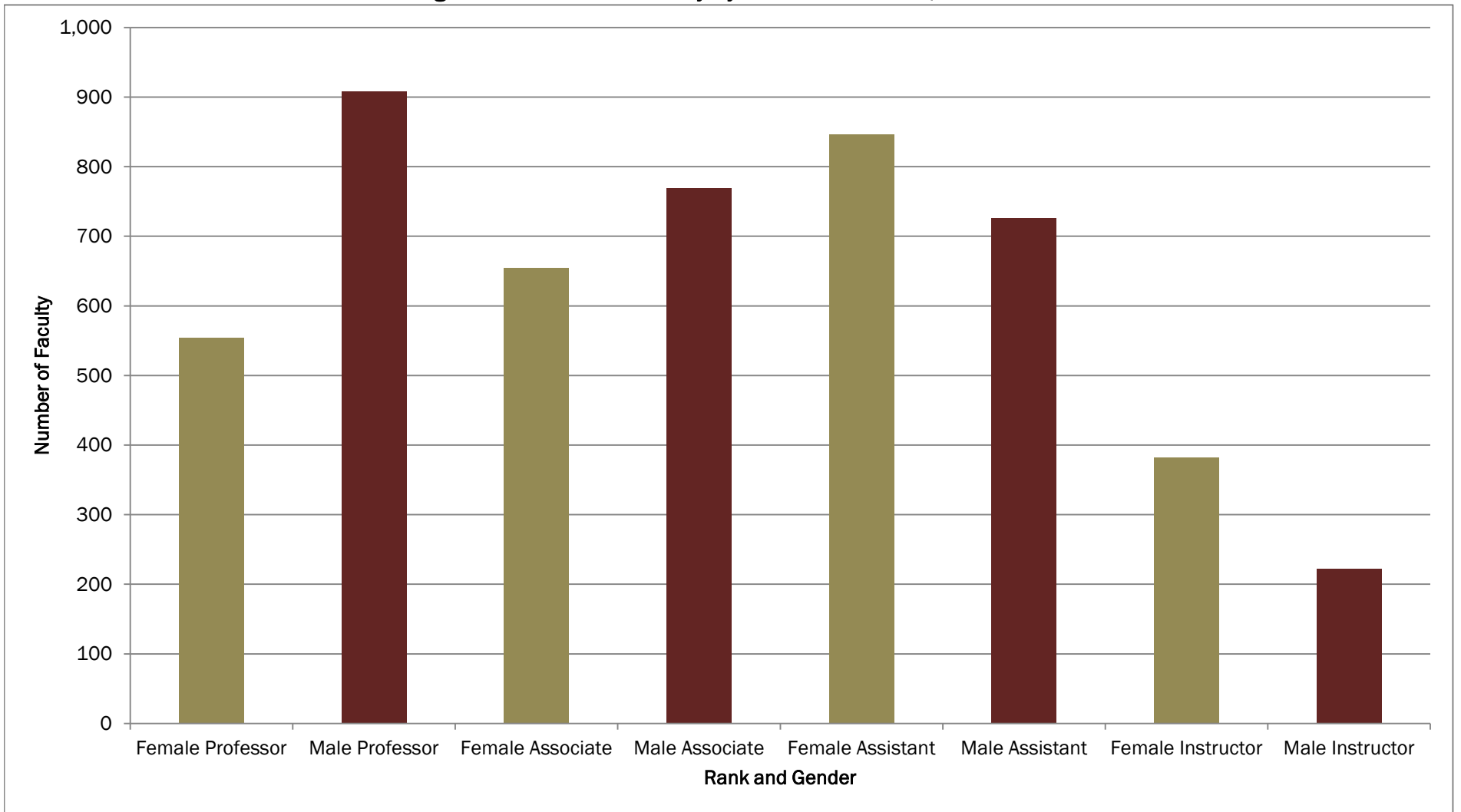

Figure 19: Full-Time Faculty by Rank and Gender, Fall 2010



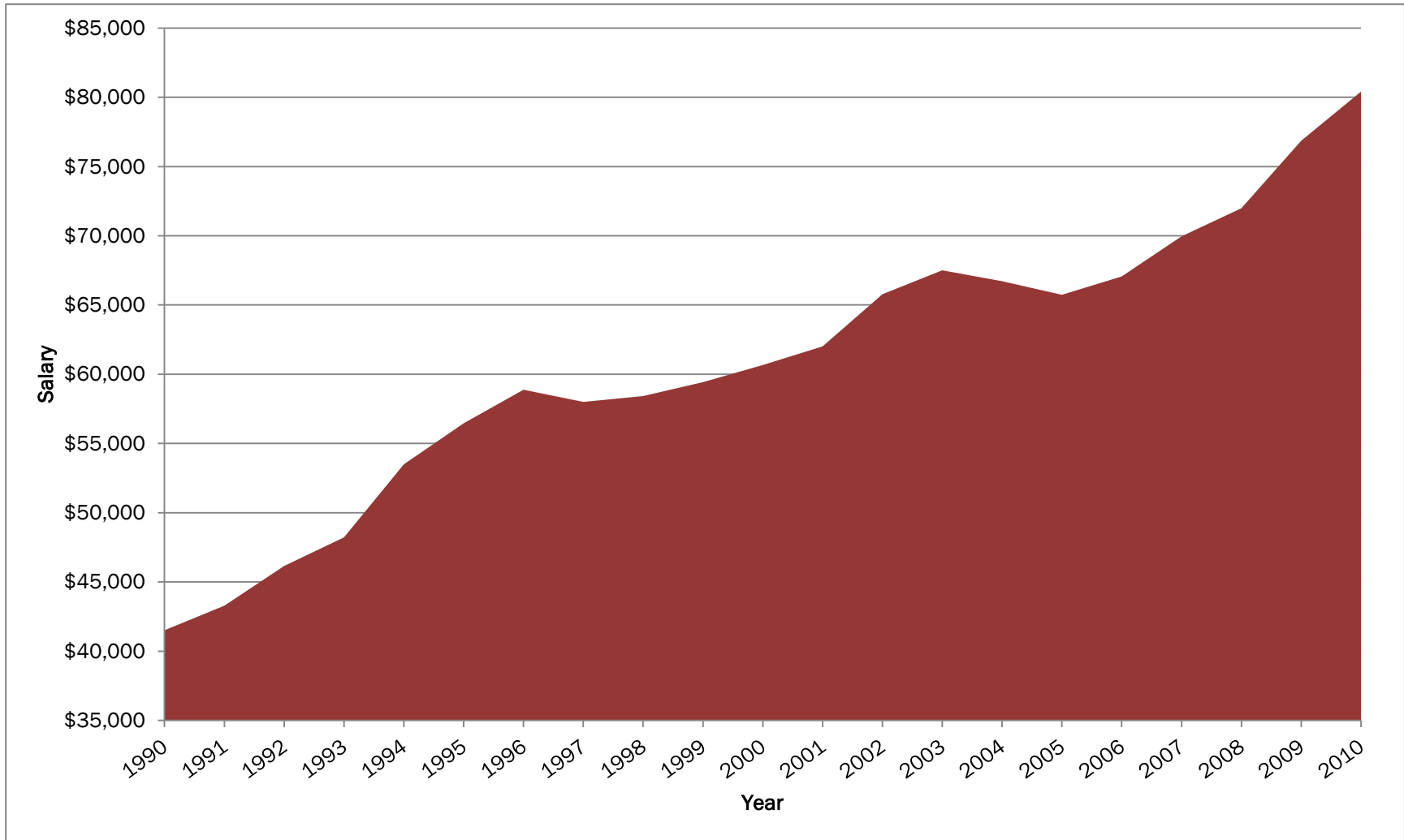

Figure 20: Average 9-month Salaries for Full-Time Faculty, All Ranks, Fall 1990-2010



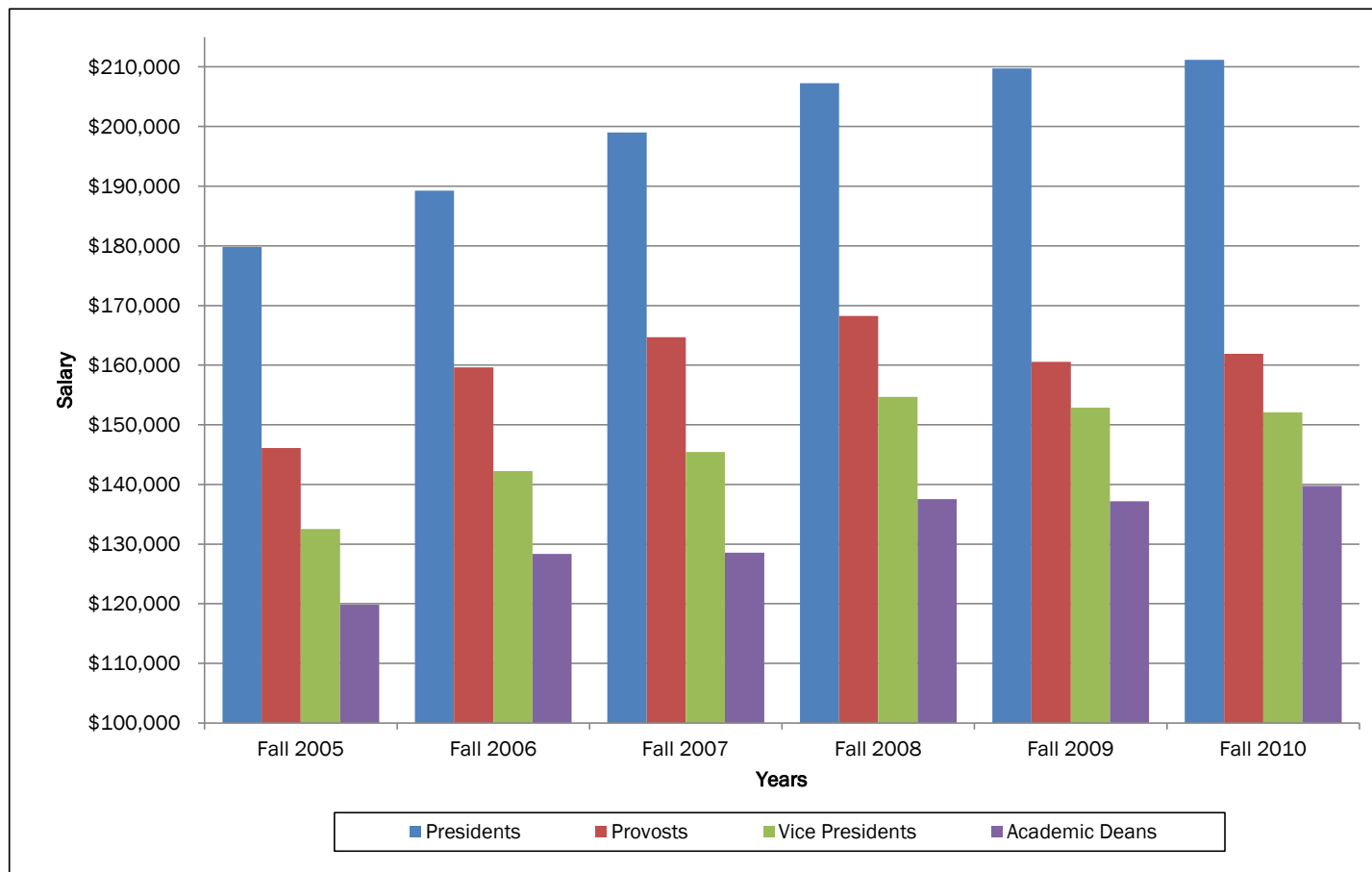

**Figure 21: Average 12-Month Salary for Senior Managers (All Positions), Fall 2005 to Fall 2010**



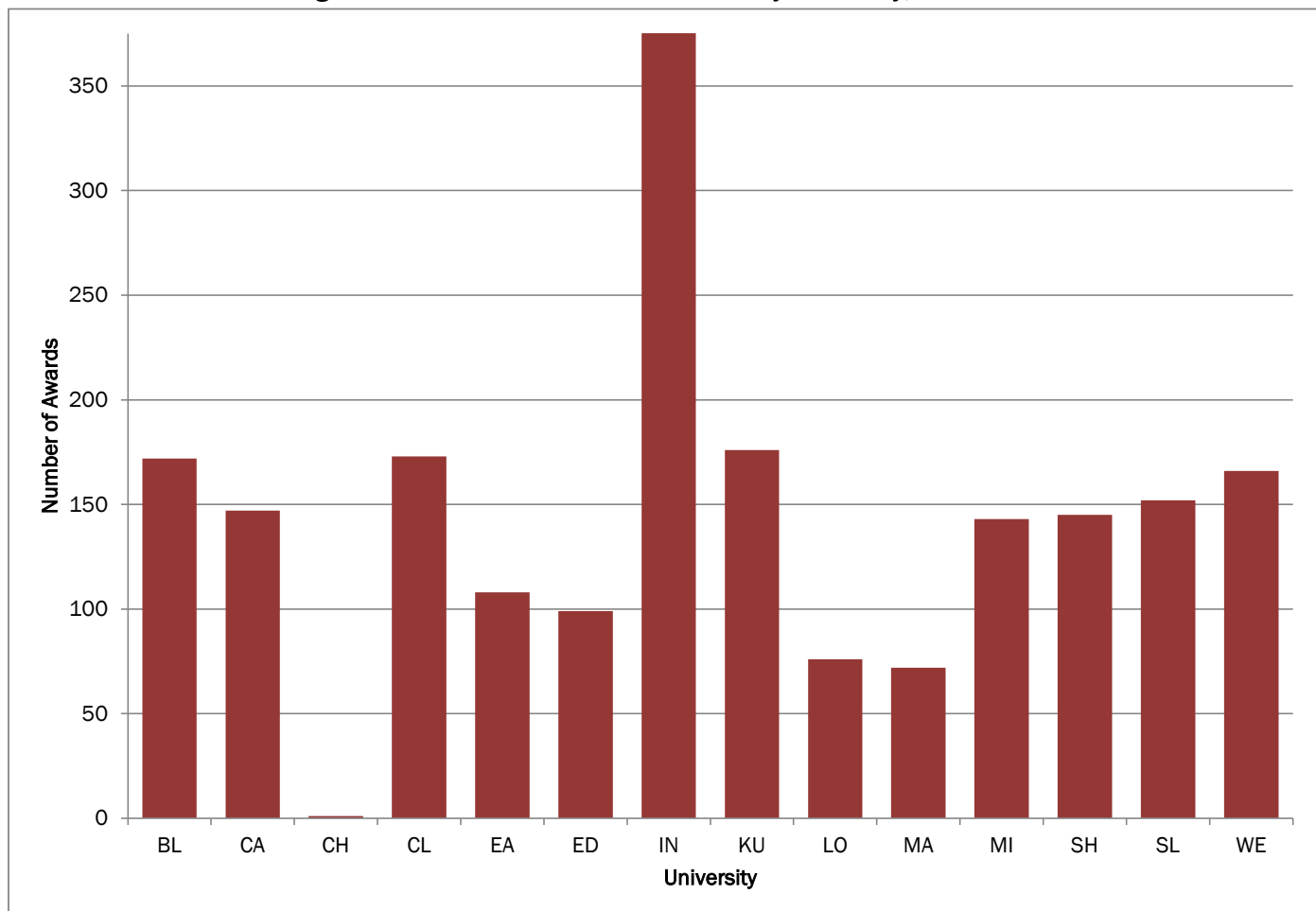
