RE: a millennium event

I am an independent researcher, PhD (Candidate of Science in Technology, 1965), an Israeli citizen, currently a pensioner, 84. As a result of my almost 30-year-long independent research in Systems Theory and Theoretical Physics, titled "**A Theory of Ether, Particles and Atoms**", that I started in Russia late in the 60s and, since 1992, have proceeded with in Israel, Europe and Canada, I obtained results amounting to a reform of modern theoretical physics and being of vital importance for the destiny of science in general - a millennium event.

Although my research has been published online, it has never been discussed and recognized officially. I think it is quite understandable nowadays, because, in particular, some physicists may consider my research a threat to their position in science. To some extent it may be, but such is the life of science. So, as an official recognition of my research is necessary anyway, I have decided now to apply to the Cavendish Laboratory for a possibility to defend there the research as a doctorate thesis.
