

MORE REPORTED**Elusive Flying Discs Provide Latest Outdoor Sport in Area**

A new game has swept West Texas and the rest of the nation: watching for the elusive flying discs.

Last night about 10:15 Patricia Sellers, nine-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jake Sellers, who live near the water filtration plant on the Buffalo Gap road, saw a disc "or something like it."

The disc was flat, the color of the moon and looked about the size of the moon. It was going fast at about the height of the trees, the child told her parents.

John Davis McClure of Hamlin, reports he saw "one of those white flying saucers sailing through the air between Hamlin and Sweetwater." The 11-year-old boy added that "it looked to be quite large."

A contrasting description of the mysterious flying objects was given Monday by Mrs. Cap Newman and her grandson, James Wil-

liams, 1534 Grape, who said the one they saw Monday night resembled a "meal platter." Instead of being silvery in color, as reported in many instances, it had a dark appearance.

I. I. Crowe of Winters, local pilot and manager of the Winters airport, and J. E. Hardee, who lives three miles southwest of Snyder on the Ira road, also reported seeing the discs Monday.

Crowe said he saw a silver object resembling an oblong ball suspended motionless in the sky over his home at 12:45 p. m. It appeared several thousand feet high, and its diameter seemed as wide as the wingspread of a good-sized plane.

Hardee observed nine saucers going in a southwest direction at a fast speed. One disintegrated south of his home, breaking into five or six pieces, and melting.
