

<h3>Pilots Searching</h3> <p>(Continued from Page One)</p> <p>the pilot of Grumman was reported that a metal disc 18 inches in diameter with "targets" and "crosses" around the hole in the center crashed into his yard with a mild explosion. He announced that he was holding it for the FBI, but after close examination found the fragments of the disc to be a "high speed" aircraft. The disc was a circular saw blade.</p> <p>A number of pilots whirled over rooftops in East St. Louis, Ill. yesterday. J. J. Hester, a locomotive engineer, gathered some of them up and found they were made of pressed white paper. It inches in diameter and with a two-inch hole in the center. Railroad workers said they looked like locomotive parking washers.</p> <p>A radio announcement that discs were flying over Leavenworth, Kan., yesterday sent hundreds into their pants for a look. Weatherman Louis Kriwak and the objects were moving eastward with the prevailing wind and probably were sent down from the stratosphere.</p> <p>A Birmingham radio station was deluged with more than 400 calls in one hour by persons who said they saw "fireballs" falling over the city and clearly outlined against nearby mountains. A carnival at Alhambra, Ala., was playing searchlights on cloud tops.</p> <p>An argument raged at Los Angeles over the cause of a particular glow in the sky and a near abort by a Federal jumbo jet. Mrs. W. C. Smith said she heard a noise "like a four-engine bomber" just before the lights went off at dawn.</p> <p>Ernest Kromsch of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, offered the explanation that a line-dropping drop during plane probably struck a power line and burned out a transformer. However, the plane was reported damaged and the cause could explain what a crop-dusting plane was doing in the air at dawn on Sunday. It was the first time any noise had been attributed to flying saucers.</p> <p>J. E. Wills, Jr., Darlington, S. C., attorney, said he saw an Army pursuit plane crashing a Wisconsin an hour 3000 feet high. However, no police reported such a chase.</p> <p>Meanwhile authorities were plagued with reports that hoaxed on the fantasia.</p> <p>An excited Chicago woman reported that she had seen a flying saucer with legs. "I was standing on my porch and I thought for sure it was coming right down and slip me in the face," she said.</p> <p>George Keizer of Denver said he saw a flying disc with an American flag on it.</p> <p>Francis Howell, Tempe, Ariz., claimed he saw a saucer roll feet in diameter disappear behind a row of trees near his home. When he called with his wife and another couple to inspect it, he said, the flat, thin, aluminum-like disc, "looked off at a high rate of speed" toward Phoenix, that made away.</p> <p>Mrs. Walter Johnson returned to Spokane, Wash., after a vacation near St. Marcus, Idaho, and after reading newspaper reports of the flying saucers, said she and several others had seen speeding white objects "as big as a four or five-room house," disappear from the forest, covered mountains.</p> <p>The first of the saucers over New York State was reported by Mrs. Kenneth Wesley of Rochester, N. Y., who said she and her husband saw an object "about the size of an ordinary saucer" flying above her back yard at 8:30 p. m. yesterday.</p> <p>New Jersey residents said they "thought" they saw flying discs over Palisades Park and nearby Bergen field last night.</p> <p>Skeptical scientists revealed the mysterious "rockets" seen over Sweden last year. Eight per cent of the "ghost rockets" proved to be meteors, but Swedish officials said the other 20 per cent could be discounted to pure imagination.</p> <p>Captain Tom Brown, Army Air Force spokesman at Washington, said the Army was trying to run the reports to ground.</p> <p>"We're not dismissing the possibility that there's something to it," he said, "and we're not dismissing the possibility that it's all a hoax."</p>	<h3>Flying What-Is-It?</h3>  <p>Coast Guardman Frank Ryan, of Seattle, Wash., says he has a picture of one of the "flying saucers" that more and more people seem to keep seeing every day all over the country. With reports of the phenomenon spreading from coast to coast, it's raising the local New Mexico mystery.</p> <p>(Continued from Page One)</p> <h3>Committee Hits</h3> <p>expected in the form of direction to a higher judicial post.</p> <p>"Judicial and executive functions may be improperly merged."</p> <p>"Absence of the judge from his regular duties increases the workload of other judges of the court, if any, and may impair judicial efficiency."</p> <p>"A non-judicial activity may produce disquiet or criticism and may be destructive of the prestige and respect of the federal judiciary."</p> <p>"A judge upon assumption of his regular duties may be called upon to justify or defend his activities under an executive commission."</p> <p>The committee explained that it did not recommend prohibitory legislation at this time but would leave the matter to the good judgment of the President and the judges.</p> <p>The late Chief Justice Harlan F. Stone was cited as an example of a man who received drafts by the executive department. Stone declined to consider chairmanship of the Atomic Energy Commission as he became a member of a United States Board Commission set up to deal with the war-time problem of the atomic atom.</p> <p>Most notable recent examples of judges leaving the bench for White House service were assignment of Justice Associate Justice Owen J. Roberts to conduct the Pearl Harbor investigation and of Associate Justice Robert H. Jackson as American prosecutor of Germany and co-chairman at Nuremberg.</p> <p>"The mantle of judicial probity cannot and should not be worn and laid aside as convenience suits," the report said.</p> <h3>UN Participation</h3> <p>(Continued from Page One)</p> <p>geographical reasons.
