

WOMAN REPORTS SEEING 'DISKS' LAND IN IDAHO

'Great Saucer Mystery' Grows Deeper

Eight of the disk-shaped objects came down for an apparent landing Thursday in a wooded area near St. Maries, Idaho.

She said eight of the objects came down one at a time, spaced, traveling from south to north. Each one, she asserted, appeared to be about the size of a 5-foot house. They were saucer-shaped, but thicker than she had expected from trading saucer reports, she said, and resembled gigantic washbasins more than disks.

"Faster to Ground"

She said the objects abruptly showed in their flight and disappeared like leaves in the breeze.

"The mysterious part was that we couldn't see them after they landed," she said. "We could see them flutter down into the timber, yet we couldn't see that they did anything to the trees."

Mrs. Johnson said the plane to return to the St. Maries area Tuesday and will like this the timber to search for the objects.

At Portland, Ore., it is said, the Oregon air guard announced a patrol will leave tomorrow morning to investigate the St. Maries region. Sheriff Grant L. Thomas at St. Maries said he would send a ground party into the woods.

Mechanics Spot One

From St. Louis came a report that News Hart, a mechanic who was trained during service in the war to spot all types of aircraft, saw one of the strange objects yesterday near Patterson, Mo. He described it as a circular with a ribbed interior and a silver stripe in color. He said it was about 200 feet high and kept turning like an airplane doing a slow roll.

A Harrison, Md., woman said she saw five tripping eastward in formation at " terrific speed." She said they were about the size of airplanes but definitely were not planes, and described them as flat, like saucers, with sometimes an oval back end. She said they "raced" with a sound like a "sawtooth" and a report of a saucer seen over the District of Columbia came from the Mrs. Kennedy, former flying cadet. He said he saw it about 8:40 tonight thru a window of his home, thought at first it was a reflection on the glass, and raised the window for an unobstructed look. He described the object as orange in the flying about 1,200 to 1,500 feet up and traveling "well over 1,000 miles an hour."

Thinkers See Score

The Cheney of Illinois, Mich., said he and 25 others on a picnic saw approximately a score of silver disks, flying high and moving fast from east to west.

John J. Flaherty of Fort Washington, N. Y., a writer, said reports of airplane beams playing through clouds create an illusion of saucer-shaped objects and that the air at high speeds. He said he has seen such "saucers" frequently and identified them as tricks played in the sky by planes from "La Guardia field, 12 miles away."

PILOT STICKS TO STORY ABOUT FLYING DISKS

Chet Smith, 25, of Bridgeport, Conn., the United Air Lines pilot, today said he saw several flying disks from his plane while flying near Detroit, Mich., on a regularly scheduled trip, arrived in Chicago yesterday on airline business, still sticking to his story.

Chet Smith, who has 1,000 hours in the air, was backed up in his story by his copilot and his stewardess. All of them saw the object northwest of the plane. The disks were seen from the side with the flat portion parallel to the ground, he said, and they traveled with the plane for 15 minutes before disappearing and fading out of sight.

IRAN PROHIBITS RUSSIAN PLANES FROM OPERATING

TEHRAN, July 6 (AP)—Operation of Russian commercial aircraft in northern Iran was apparently prohibited today by a decree of the Iranian government. It said it was decreed that the Russians would be permitted to operate, and must do so, in the United States and Canada. The decree specified routes to be followed by foreign aircraft operating in the country and prohibited flights for any other than emergency reasons.

Russian commercial planes have been flying from Teheran to Kabul, Besh and Meshed weekly since the last dispute, reported and caused protests by the Iranian government that the operation is illegal.
