

Parable of the Wealthy Man- February 7

Parents: In a world bent on enticing kids with the trendiest fashions, newest tech gadgets, and tastiest treats, how can families equip their children to view money in a God pleasing way? Let's take a look at what Jesus had to say.



Read: Luke 12:13-21 The Parable of the Wealthy Man 13 Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me."

14 Jesus replied, "Man, who appointed me a judge or an arbiter between you?" 15 Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."

16 And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. 17 He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' 18 "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. 19 And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."

20 "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?' 21 "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

Discuss: What does Jesus tell the crowd to watch out for? *Greed—a selfish desire to gather as many things for ourselves as possible.*

The rich man thought if he stored enough food he could take life easy and focus on himself. Was this pleasing to God? No, The man was storing up things just for himself. He wasn't thinking about God or others at all.

What do you think the difference is between <u>worshipping wealth</u> or <u>worshipping with our wealth</u>? Worshipping wealth means to place money or things above Jesus. Worshipping with our wealth means to selflessly give what we have to Jesus.

Jesus sacrificed everything for us by going to the cross. How can we give what we have to Jesus? There are so many ways! Out of thankfulness, we can give money, time, and talents to a neighbor in need. We can serve at church or in our community just to name a few.

Key Point: Serve Jesus Above Things

Serve Jesus (Take flat hands with the palms facing up and move back and forth, next, point to center of one palm)

Above All Things (Raise both hands and sweep outward)

Prayer: Dear God, We praise You for being so generous. Forgive us when we're not content and focus on trying to get more things. Help us show our gratitude for You by serving others. Amen.
