

Dear Duncan:

Our client, Nashville Presbytery, was served recently with the Complaint in the referenced action. Pursuant to Tenn. Rule of Civ. Proc. 11, we request that your client dismiss his claims against the Nashville Presbytery in this case. If he fails to do so, we expect to file the attached Motion for Sanctions.

For the most part, the basis for this request is set forth in the draft Rule 11 motion for sanctions sent to you by the attorneys for Covenant Presbyterian Church of Nashville and Jim Bachmann. Additionally, this lawsuit annears to be based on the allegations that were asserted in the June 19, 2013 lawsuit (No. REDACT filed by your client in the Circuit Court of Davidson County. The dismissal of the claims in that lawsuit against the Nashville Presbytery has been confirmed by the Tennessee Court of Appeals. Regardless of whether that court allows for the rehearing that Mr. Davis requested, the fact remains that the claims in this lawsuit against the Nashville Presbytery mirror claims in that previous lawsuit. Further, based on your client's prolific communications about the subject matter of both lawsuits, it is clear that this latest suit was filed for in improper purpose with the sole intention of harassing the Nashville Presbytery and other defendants.

Page 2 August 1, 2014

In sum, Mr. Davis' claims against the Nashville Presbytery in the referenced lawsuit are not warranted under the law and were brought for an improper purpose. I trust that you will agree that this latest lawsuit should be dismissed and act accordingly. If not, we reserve the right to file the attached motion.

You were still in school when you met Nancy's family? Describe Pauline Gore, if you will.

Pauline Gore? She would be my choice of a mother. I would rather have Pauline as a mother than any woman that I know right now. In my life. Pauline would be my first choice to be a mother. She was intelligent, interesting, loving, caring. She cared about us--that is, Nancy's friends. She truly cared about who we were, and what we were doing, and where we were going, and what our ambitions were; and what part she could contribute to our life. And she was anxious to introduce us to her friends and her way of life. A very unselfish woman; but very kind, considerate, and loving. I can't say enough good things about Pauline Gore.

Mrs. Gore was the ultimate in confidence, in a confident woman. She knew who she was, and she took great pride in who she was. There wasn't any doubt in Pauline's mind that she was a good person, a good mother, that she knew the right directions to send her children. She was right about religion; and she was right about her politics.

DECLARATION

Under penalty of perjury, I state that I am competent to make this declaration and that this declaration is based on my own personal knowledge as follows:

On July 6, 2008, when I went to the front door of Covenant's Building to pick up my 13-year old granddaughter, Daisy, there were two unfamiliar men standing with her.

On June 6, 2010, Daisy was desperate to end the shunning, harassment, and bullying she had endured at Harpeth Hall and elsewhere. Since no one was helping her, she wanted to return to Covenant to request an apology from Paster Jim Bachmann with the hope that things might improve for her with other classmates who shunned her or were cruel to her. I agreed to go back to Covenant with her, my daughter and my grandson.

On August 8, 2010, I asked JIM BACHMANN after a Covenant service to apologize for mistreating my family as I had also done before. He threatened me with a lawsuit. This was in the lobby on a service on Sunday.

On August 15, 2010, Catherine, Daisy, Drew and I went to Covenant for a Sunday service. As we approached the sanctuary, we saw a Metro Police car parked in front of the entrance and it scared us.

On August 22, 2010, after church at Covenant, WORRICK ROBINSON actually chased after me in the parking lot. I told him to leave me alone because I was afraid of him. He also chased Catherine and Daisy who were with me.

On August 29, 2010, three men ran to block me, Catherine and Daisy at the front entrance of the Covenant sanctuary telling us we could not go inside. They were Tem Pulliam, Lee Bryant, and Herb Kneeland. I took out a piece of paper and wrote down their names. Daisy

First of all, if the deposition is going to be video taped or recorded, I would like a copy of it once we are finished.

In our meeting, Mr. RED and Redacted made it clear that this process was going to be brutal and tough for me to endure. I knew y'all would come after me financially, as Redacted did the other day. I knew you would try to wear me down emotionally and take advantage of the fact that I don't have a lawyer so that I would quit.

I get it. This is your job. You want to make enough money to take nice family vacations and to have a favorable reputation in the community. Your family is not being lied about to police and you don't have to scrape dimes off of the car floor to pay for enough gas to get home.

John Wayne once said, "True grit is making a decision and standing by it, doing what must be done. No moral man can have peace of mind if he leaves undone what he knows he should've done."

You have the choice to treat girls how you feel is necessary when doing your job. I have the choice to chase justice for all of the bullied girls who have been told that they are "overreacting" or "just going through a phase". There are little girls today that are naively seeking approval from older men online because they don't have friends in school and feel lonely on Friday nights. There are girls cutting themselves with razor blades on the floor of the shower, sobbing in a pool of their own blood because they have been convinced that they are the problem. I have the choice to either let them suffer or give them hope and show them that their lives mean something by standing up for myself.

10 years ago I was crying myself to sleep, begging God to give me a chance to wear a plaid skirt. Those prayers left me with a reputation smashed by lies and no will to live. What else could Harpeth Hall possibly do to hurt me? They killed my childhood dream and then sent you guys to finish me off. Let's just get this thing over with.

I will see you men on Thursday. Daisy

Hi all -

My name is Daisy Davis. I'm not used to writing emails, but for all of you who have been following the child molestation coverup at Covenant, I wanted to take a chance to update you.

This morning around 11:30, Austin Davis, my unarmed father, was falsely accused and arrested. He was taken downtown to be prosecuted and jailed by Metro Police. I was told that REDACTED also went to the court to prosecute him. The child molester, however, has still yet to be prosecuted although it appears that the statute of limitation on his history of sexual abuse has not yet expired.

If the paying members of Covenant are the rightful property owners, and not the church's leadership team, then the members are in charge of important decisions being made about the property. They deserved to vote before any action was taken against my dad. There should've been a congressional meeting that allowed for all member's questions to be answered in detail. The information provided to the members should have included that John Perry confessed the child molestation, that he was not prosecuted, and that he was allowed to remain a member after he confessed. They also needed to address whether he abused other children while he was running a safe house and if he was prosecuted for sexually abusing them. The church leadership also needs to explain why my dad is a "threat" for informing people of the coverup if his fact-based allegations are proven to be correct. The child molester in Belle Meade needs to be properly prosecuted before a guy just trying to go to church is.

It's easy to write off my dad. He has been ostracized and lied about by the community. It's easy to write off his 20 year old daughter, too. It was easy to write off the sexually abused victim when RED sought help. It's easy, but is it right? Easy silences and undermines, but doing the right thing empowers and protects. Redacted = RED

For those of you who don't want to get involved, I understand. It's messy and it's hard to be brave when your social status is at stake. Maintaining a good reputation can be done if you are willing to lie, cheat, and steal to keep it. Reputation means having a good PR team, but character means having a good track record.

There are people my age looking up to adults to see how they will react in the face of injustice. Our generation is just as scared as you all are, if not more so. We see violence and corruption at every turn and we crave hope and true leadership. We want to see our mothers and fathers take a stand. We want to know that if we live with integrity and pursue the truth, then evil will not prevail and our bravery will be rewarded. Our generation needs more heroes to admire, not cowards.

When I was little I read a book about a girl whose father takes a stand for justice. The town she lives in shames him and settles for the lies because the community is too lazy, too scared, or too intolerant to concern itself with the truth. There is a line from the book that says that it's a sin to kill a mockingbird. I always thought that line meant that it's wrong to take away someone's innocence. However, after today, I have a different point of view. Mockingbirds' songs reflect the world around them. They sing the truth they find in their surroundings. Maybe what Harper Lee was trying to say is don't shoot the messenger.

I am proud of my dad. He is my hero and I will stand by the truth with him.

them I decided that Covenant was an evil place with bad intentions. I no longer felt safe around the police.

After all this was done to our family, we started hearing people say that my dad was crazy and dangerous. When I was in sixth grade at an MBA football game, a friend from my old school pulled me to the side of the crowd of kids and told me a girl who was a member at Covenant was telling people that my dad is a crazy man who writes untrue letters to the members. I felt embarrassed and angry. This in cident made me' very cautious and aware of the members and some of the old friends at the church when I saw them in public. I thought nothing would ever be the same.

My sister was hit much harder than I was by the church. Through middle school, I did not receive as much negativity as Daisy, who was completely estrains Daisy lost virtually all of her friends, and soon became a completely different person. She was always locked up in her room during the day, and she would have intense alternations with my parents literally every night. I was scared of what she may have done to herself or to my parents. She would sometimes leave suicide notes and she would run


away from home. My sister, who was once the happiest person in the room, became someone completely different. It felt like having a stranger sleep in the room next to you.

The events that occurred since that day at the church have made me feel scared of the police, mad at the church, confused of right and wrong, and embarrassed of my family's "crazy" reputation. I have second degree bullying effects. As my sister was bullied, I feet the same way as I watched her cry and scream at night. Most nights I would sleep on the shoor of my parents room because I was afraid of Dalsy, and I was afraid of someone trying to hurt my family. I used to double check the locks on the doors every night.





She said to Dr. Langberg, "I'm so glad we don't have this in the PCA." Dr. Langberg told her at her next women's ministry conference to list child sexual abuse as an issue faced by women and see what happens. She said don't even mention it, just list it in one of the handouts. A few months later the head of women's ministry called Dr. Langberg and said, "What do I do? They are coming out of the woodwork!"

Dear Ms. Davis:

This firm has been retained by Covenant Presbyterian Church of Nashville ("Covenant") regarding the matters set forth herein. This letter serves as notice to you that due to the actions and disruptive behavior you demonstrated immediately outside the sanctuary during Covenant's late worship service on Sunday, November 15, 2015, you do not have the permission or the consent of Covenant to enter upon or otherwise remain on the property owned by Covenant located at 33 Burton Hills Boulevard, Nashville, Tennessee (the "Property"). As a result, you are prohibited from returning to the Property at any time whatsoever, regardless of the day of the week or the time of day. This prohibition is in effect 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

In the event that you ignore this letter, Covenant will immediately notify law enforcement to remove you from the Property and arrest you for criminal trespass and for any other violations of Tennessee law. Although not required to enforce the Tennessee criminal trespass statute, Covenant has filed an Authorization to Enforce & Prosecute Criminal Trespass Violations ("Criminal Trespass Waiver") with law enforcement to expedite your arrest should you return to the Property.

We hope that you will choose to voluntarily comply with this letter and Tennessee law.


