

The seven principles are:

Principle 1: Create high-level corporate leadership for gender equality

Principle 2: Treat all people fairly at work, respecting and supporting non-

discrimination and human rights

Principle 3: Ensure the health, wellbeing, and safety of all workers, whether male or female

Principle 4: Promote education, training, and professional development for women

Principle 5: Implement supply chain, marketing practices, and enterprise development that empower women

Principle 6: Champion equality through community initiatives and advocacy

Principle 7: Measure and report publicly on progress to create gender equality

All around the world, women have lesser access to basic rights, higher education, social and political participation, and representation. They also face health and safety issues. Elimination of female violence is very critical also. These and other emerging issues faced by women should be dealt with fundamental importance.
