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#### LIST OF AGENCY WITNESSES

Pursuant to the Administrative Judge's revised Case Management Order, dated March 12, 2019, the Agency provides the following list of potential Agency witnesses for the above-referenced case. The Class Agents' claims have been generally identified, to include competitive and non-competitive promotions, reassignments, assignments, and hiring and recruitment from January 23, 1994 to February 24, 2017, pursuant to the Administrative Judge's Order Defining the Class, Granting Complainant's Motion to Amend Class Charge, and Authorizing Discovery.

## I. AGENCY WITNESSES REGARDING ASSIGNMENTS, REASSIGNMENTS AND HIRING POLICIES OR PRACTICES

Class Agents have not yet identified the specific non-competitive promotions, assignments, reassignments and hiring policies or practices they will raise for adjudication. Accordingly, the Agency is not able at this point to determine its rebuttal witnesses to any specific claim Class Agents may eventually raise. When the Agency is informed of other specific policies and specific personnel actions involving specific Class Agents, or other Class Members, additional witnesses will be named. For instance, if the Class Agents allege that Office of Preference (OPREF) voluntary reassignments have a disparate impact on African Americans, then the Agency would need to add the District Managers that had a role in the decision for OPREF. The same would be true for an allegation that any other specific assignments have a disparate impact. Thus, at this time, the Agency is unable to identify witnesses relating to claims that have not been specifically raised or alleged by specific examples.

#### II. AGENCY WITNESSES REGARDING MERIT PROMOTION

The Agency provides all witnesses with relevant information on the specific issue of merit promotion. At issue are approximately 4,400 Merit Promotion Announcements for operational positions that have been identified as potentially relevant to the merit promotion selection process. Because the Agency does not know who will be Class Agents' witnesses or which class members will be witnesses regarding the merit promotion selection process, other than the specific Class Agents, the Agency cannot identify which of the following potential witnesses it will need to call as witnesses for hearing. The Agency does not intend to call every witness listed below at the administrative hearing on Class Agents' claims and, instead, is providing the names in order to give Class Agents' counsel preliminary information as to potential witnesses.
