She used to live in Texas and still has family that lives there. One of her granddaughters is living with her and her husband right now. She only uses proper grammar and if you are talking about a number for example the area code 704 you must say seven "zero" four, I've made the mistake more than once by saying "O" instead of zero and believe me she will correct you. She makes sure that no one's midriff is showing she always says something like, "either pull it up or pull it down"; it refers to your top or your bottoms. Her workspace has to be a certain way with two pens on one side of the register for customers to use and one on the other side of the register for associates to use, if the return slips need to be signed she has to have those signed as soon as possible. She keeps everything stacked neatly in it's place, and she must have more than enough change in the register at all times.

I have enjoyed listening to her share stories about her family and other topics brought up during that specific day. She is a sweetheart and even though some of her ways of working may seem a little crazy, that's what makes Frieda who she is. She uses humor in her way of thinking and if you ever get her laughing she'll turn red in the face and you'll think she's gonna pass out, but when she finally catches her breath you'll both share a big smile from the heart. I think I appreciate Frieda because she makes things brighten up with her personality.
