Dear Friends,

We are writing to inform you that we are planning a religious procession and service at the Concord Naval Weapons Station on Sunday, June 5, 1988. It will be a "March for the Moratorium" - a gathering of religious leaders calling for an end to U.S. military aid to El Salvador. Eleven religious denominations will be participating in this event and we anticipate between 300 and 400 people.

We will assemble at the BART parking lot on Port Chicago Highway south of Route 4 at 3:00pm and begin the procession at about 3:15pm. We intend to walk north on the east side of PCH to Route 4, and then cross and continue on the west side of the road to the tracks where the service will be held. We will provide traffic monitors to ensure that traffic regulations are complied with.


The interfaith service at the tracks should begin shortly after 4:00 pm and last for approximately one hour. We will construct a small (no higher than 2'), temporary, speaking platform at the north end of the vigil site on public land just in front of the yellow traffic barrier. We will move gear off the site to accomodate the large group of people expected that day. While the designated rally space is a swath of landsouth of the platform and east of the yellow line, we do anticipate some flow of people over the yellow line demarcating base property. Because this event will take place on a Sunday afternoon, we do not expect this will inconvenience the base in any way.

The procession and service will not involve civil disobedience and we will have monitors on hand at all times to ensure public saftety, so we do not feel a large police presence is needed for the rally.
