Media Statement February 4, 1988
for immediate release

Nuremberg Actions wishes to thank all conscientious people in the peace movement who have worked to influence the U. S. House of Representatives to convince them not to violate international law again by appropriating military weapons for the contra terrorists who are and have been attacking the sovereign nation of Nicaragua. We are pleased to see that now a majority of the House is not willing to commit those crimes anymore.

We shall continue to oppose any aid whatever to the contras until they lay down their weapons and stop attacking the people of Nicaragua. However, if they renounce all use of violence and disband, we would not oppose humanitarian assistance to individual contras through a recognized international charitable institution until they are re-assimilated into Nicaraguan society, although we recommend that the U. S. Congress first consider giving humanitarian aid to all the people of Nicaragua in reparation for the war crimes the U. S. has perpetrated against them.

We of Nuremberg Actions will continue to vigil at the railroad tracks by Concord Naval Weapons Station and block trains and trucks which carry deadly munitions to kill the innocent people of El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, the Philippines, South Korea, Afghanistan, Angola, and God knows what others.

Again we thank the American people for rising up to meet this challenge, and we intend to persevere until we transform this militaristic society into one that solves all problems by nonviolent means so that true peace and justice can be attained.
