

# How To Embed Quotes in Your Essay Like a Boss

Essay writing is one of the basic forms of academic writing. It is a piece of writing wherein the authors provide their ideas and thoughts into a short paper when he [write my essay](#). There are different types of essays ranging from explanatory to expository and from argumentative to descriptive one. Structurally, these essays differ from each other to a great extent but, there are common elements that bind them together.



A literary essay is one type of essay that focuses on evaluating, and interpreting a literary piece of writing or an aspect of literary work. It is an academic source of writing focused on the evaluation and examination of literary writing. As the literary essay is related to literature so, much attention is given to how to quote poetry in the literary essay. As compared to prose, quoting poetry is much more tricky and a bit difficult. However, several different useful ways and steps can help to quote poetry into a literary essay properly when [write my paper](#). A few of the steps required to quote poems properly in the literary essay are mentioned below.

Poetry involves a particular style of writing that is quite different from writing prose. Therefore, it requires particular formatting and style. Quoting poetry also differs in terms of long and short phrases, and quotes. To quote a poem proper referencing style is required. This referencing style is required to give readers an idea about the source from where you have extracted the quoted material. The referencing style of writing is also significant, professionals have maintained certain writing formats that

are to be followed by the writers while writing an essay. These styles include the Modern Language Association commonly called MLA, American Psychological Association, or Chicago style of writing. However, the most commonly used style for writing an essay in literature is MLA.

To begin with, poetry quotations involves short as well as long quotes. However, any type of quote first requires the introduction of reference. Particularly for the longer quotes, no reference can be made instantly. While writing a long quote from poetry, proper background and context for the quote must be provided to integrate the quote from the poem. If you are finding it difficult in quoting long quotes, you may ask for help from an [essay writer](#) to properly integrate quotes of poems, for you. Shorter quotes, however, do not require much extensive introduction of the reference but short quotes cannot be cited directly. A shorter introduction like "As the poet says" must be stated before putting direct reference from the poem for a shorter quote.

Also, the use of dashes while referencing a shorter quote from the poem can better indicate that some portion of the poem is being used as a reference in the essay to support the argument. Therefore, one should take this factor into account while quoting a reference from the poem; the introduction to the quote must be given in the literary essay while quoting any reference from the poem.

Moreover, long quotes and short quotes formatting must be maintained according to the style of referencing being used in the essay. The longer quote of the poem is considered to be 4 lines or more than four lines from the poem. For example, in MLA more than four lines require block formatting by making a left indentation. Another style of writing requires different formatting styles. So, one should follow the proper style of writing following the formatting style employed by the writer in the essay.

However, if you are finding it difficult to properly format your document, you may seek help from an [essay writing service](#) to properly format your essay document. Besides this, the use of reference as a source of evidence to support the argument in a literary essay must be integrated and related to the argument completely. Ice sandwich rule, proper explanation of the reference, and introduction of the reference must be ensured while quoting any reference from the poem in the literary essay.

Another important aspect of quoting a poem in a literary essay involves to mention the poet's name. However, if a reference to multiple poets has to be made, then one should mention the poet's name every time. As MLA requires the poet's name in parenthesis followed by the line numbers of the poem used as reference. However, while using APA, the poet's name is followed by the year of publication of the poem. Most of the students find it difficult to properly employ referencing styles. Therefore, an author should take into consideration proper referencing style while citing a poem in an essay.

Moreover, the proper style of mentioning lines used as reference must be taken into account. If one is using the MLA style of referencing, then it is mandatory to mention the line numbers from the poem that are used as reference. In case of an irregular sequence of lines, one needs to separate line numbers by the use of the comma. However, in another style of writing there is no need to mention line numbers while citing any source from the poem.

And don't forget one thing! works cited or references must also be included at the end of paper. Proper citation of the source must be ensured according to the style of writing used in the essay. Name of the poet, name or title of the poem, volume and issue, publisher, and the website or other sources must also be enlisted in the reference page according to the conventions of formatting style.

To conclude, quoting poems in a literary essay involves a series of certain guidelines and steps. Following these steps, [paper writing service](#) can write an impressive literary essay with proper citation of references and quotations from the poem.

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
