4. Pass the Saskatoon Italian Centre

Winter Trail Network of Richard St. Barbe Baker Afforestation Area Urban Regional Park

This 326 acre woodland oasis planted under the 1972 Green Survival Program was preserved in perpetuity as an urban regional park. The Fatlanders Fat Tire Brigade created the Winter Trail Network. The park name honours a global pioneer of land reclamation through tree planting, the founder of the International Tree Foundation; Richard St. Barbe Baker LLB OBE. 2. Drive past the landfill and Civic Operations Centre
3. Turn right on Cedar Villa Road (Twp Rd 362-A)
4. Turn north into the parking lot for the 14.5 acre SW Off Leash Recreation Area (SW OLRA)

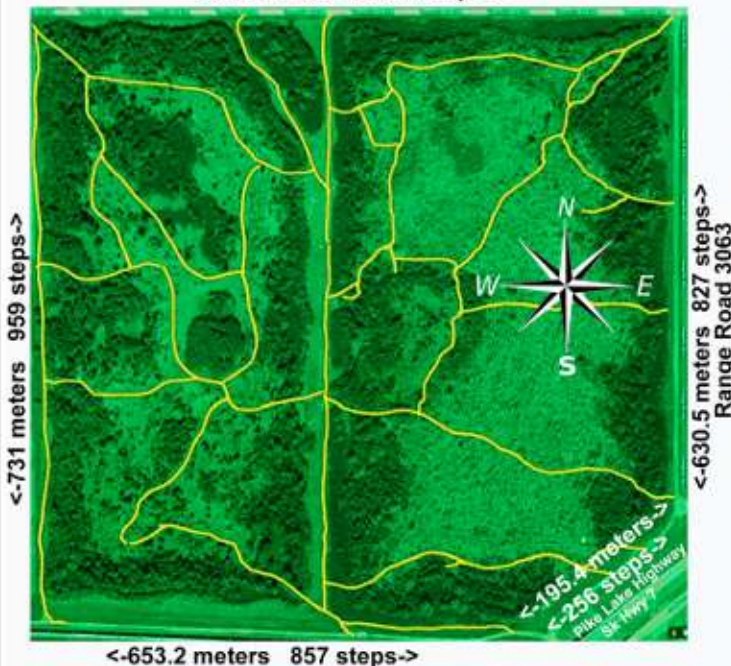
