## Michigan's Western Gateway

Ironwood is the gateway for many metropolitan areas into the Upper Peninsula and to the rest of Michigan. We are situated in a location that funnels traffic to flow through our main highway corridor. Ironwood is located on the Michigan and Wisconsin border and is only 100 miles from Duluth Minnesota.

## Michigan's Iron Belle Trail

Michigan is completing a non motorized trail for both biking and hiking that will run from Ironwood to Belle Isle in Detroit. Ironwood and the Western UP are ahead of the game with over 10 miles of paved trail with 2 more to be completed. In connection with the Iron Belle, subsidiary trails that weave throughout town connect neighborhoods to commercial districts and to recreation destinations. Adventure right out of your front door.







# Public and Private Investment

## Public Investment

Over \$40 Million in 10 years which include:

- \$10 Million Hwy US2 reconstruction
- \$12 Million in local street reconstruction (95% local streets in good or excellent conditions).
- \$1.4 Million in downtown enhancements
- \$500 Thousand in new playground, parks and non motorized paths (over \$5 Million in non motorized paths regionally).
- \$600 Thousand in housing rehabilitation and blight demolition.
- Award Winning City of Ironwood Comprehensive Plan.
- \$9 Million water treatment facility.
- \$1.7 Million Downtown City Square.
- New Civic Center & Ice Rink on Gogebic Community College Campus

## Private Investment

The City of Ironwood has had increased private investment in the past 10 years as a result of the relentless public investment. We have seen a new interest in highway commercial, downtown commercial and industrial properties. Highway commercial properties and owners are reinvesting into their properties to reflect the new enhancements. A number of enhancements are Super One Foods, Dunham's Sports, Tractor Supply, Burger King, AmericInn, Walgreen's, Shoe Sensation, to name some of the major improvements.

Downtown Ironwood has seen many new businesses open in the last year with many notable businesses such as Contrast Coffee, Cold Iron Brewing, Bake Superior Bread, European Treats, Zak's Realty, Stem's Flower Shop, Integrity Salon, About the Hair, Holm's Hobby, Suffolk Street Eatery, The White Rabbit, UP-N-Smoke BBQ, and more.

Our industrial park has expanded and has seen it fill up with the exception of 1 lot. New additions to the park are Xcel Energy, expansion of Keweenaw Land Associates, Waupaca Foundary, and Ottawa Forest Products.

## Regional Private Investment

Aspirus Ironwood has invested tens of millions of dollars into a new clinic, and complete upgrades on all of their existing buildings. Highland Copper north of Ironwood will begin in the next 5 years and will employ a large amount of highly skilled people. San Fransisco based tech company Expensify recently opened up in Ironwood and now employs over 200 contracted workers.

Copper Peak the worlds largest international ski flying jump is receiving a \$20 million face-lift and is set to become the national training grounds for USA Nordic. Other investments at this site include Red Bull sponsored events such as the Red Bull 400 and Copper Peak Trails Fest mountain bike race.



# Why Ironwood?

## Notable Stats

- US2 has over 10,600 cars that travel per day in the City of Ironwood, making US2 the second busiest road in the Western UP.
- Over 25,000 residents travel to Ironwood for groceries.
- The Ironwood area can support up to 5,000 over night tourists at a single time.
- Many UP residents go through Ironwood to get to Duluth, Minneapolis, and many other major metropolitan areas.
- Ironwood is the Western Gateway into Michigan and the UP.
- The Ironwood area has hundreds of miles of motorized and non motorized trails, access to world class recreation and outdoor areas, 4 major ski resorts; all of which are uniquely set in thousands of acres of forest and Lake Superior shoreline, making Ironwood the premier outdoor adventure destination in the Midwest.
- Copper Peak is set to be the International ski training grounds for the US Olympic team and will begin hosting meets and other events like the Red Bull 400, which draws thousands of visitors per event.
- The Porcupine Mountains draw over 600,000 visitors per year; visitors mainly stay in the Ironwood area.
- Ironwood has hundreds of miles of cross country ski trails, hundreds of miles of snowmobile trails, new mountain bike trails at Copper Peak, Mt. Zion and Miners Memorial Heritage Park.
- Average of 188" of annual snow fall.

# Education

## Luther L. Wright K-12 School

Recently remodeled and enlarged to include elementary students. The new K-12 school has consolidated services and has increased efficiency of facilities to be the top school in the area. Ironwood has boasted a small class size with a group of teachers that care for their students. A new \$16 million early learning facility addition and main building improvements are projected to be started in 2023.

Luther L. Wright offers a five-year program so that students can obtain their high school degree while also obtaining an associate degree from Gogebic Community College.

Luther L. Wright offers many advanced placement classes, and collaborates with the Gogebic-Ontonagon Intermediate School District to provide more classes such as welding, programming, IT, Nursing, Agriculture, and more.

New to the area students is the Gogebic Range Robotics team.

## Gogebic Community College

With record enrollments in a number of their programs, GCC maintains a rare student-to-faculty ration of 15:1, with an average of 1300 - 1500 students per year. New programs, services, and faculty education continue to keep offerings current for today's workforce and to address our world's ever-changing needs. GCC embraces partnerships with key local businesses and initiates discussions on new programming to help area employers fill job openings.

GCC offers five degrees all of which include varying levels of general education core requirements: Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Applied Science, Associate of Applied Business, and Associate of Applied Technology.

GCC offers technical curriculum including: Automotive Technology, Building Trades & Construction Technology, Cosmetology, Manufacturing, Ski Area Management, & Welding.


