A postgraduate foundation program in dentistry that lasts at least two years and includes clinical practice in both primary and secondary care settings is required to get in. Before applying for a specialty registrar position, it is recommended to work as a DCT or in a clinical teaching position in the specialty to gain relevant experience and opportunities to publish. During training, trainees spend a lot of time in specialist medical clinics and outpatient clinics, where they meet new patients and check up on existing ones with the help of a consultant.

To be successful in the field of oral medicine, you need to be able to communicate well with both patients and coworkers. You also need to be able to actively listen, be a strong leader and know yourself, have a curious mind, and want to help patients live better lives. The majority of oral medicine experts serve as consultants for the National Health Service or hold honorary consultant positions at universities.

You need at least two years of clinical experience after earning your dental degree before you can be considered for hire.
