Solve the mystery: Find the Missing Linden Tree.



- Flowers: Hang in clusters of 5-7, highly fragrant, bloom in mid-June or early July.
- Leaves: Singular, alternate, heart-shaped, finely toothed, often fuzzy undersides, asymmetrically attached to stem end.
- Fruit: Nut-like drupe, round shape, often slightly fuzzy.
