



Unfortunately for the school, they will have significant difficulty growing their budget via referendums when they are actively isolating both the community and the parents in the district. We have a diverse community across many different perspectives. In order for the school to grow in trust, funding, and participation, they have to expand away from the scores/school-led educational system, and move back to a partnership-led education system with parents, teachers, and community members participating. 
