City Skate Park Vandalizers Arrested

Flemingsburg KY, July 17, 2017: On this date, Flemingsburg Police responded to a vandalism complaint at the Flemingsburg city skate park; the complaint was reported to police by city streets supervisor Gordon Pepper. Police arrived and found every skate ramp had been spray painted with graffiti and vulgar comments. A check of the city park video surveillance cameras shows a black Toyota Camry arriving at the city park at 11:25 P.M. upon arrival two occupants get out of the car, one male and one female. The female suspect can be seen handing a can of what appears to be spray paint to the male; and can be seen shaking it up as he enters the skate park. The couple can be seen spray painting and taking cell phone pictures after spray painting the ramps. When they are finished with the spray cans the male can be seen throwing both cans of spray paint into the creek





nearby, which police were able to recover. Officer Brad Crawford has identified the suspects as Tori Ishmael, 18 of Flemingsburg and Jeremy Insko, 19 of Flemingsburg.

A criminal complaint was signed later this same day by Officer Crawford against Ishmael and Insko. Ishmael and Insko have been charged with Criminal Mischief 3rd degree, a Class B misdemeanor and Criminal Littering, a Class A misdemeanor. Ishmael and Insko were arrested on July 24th 2017 and charged with these offenses.

Tori Ishmael and Jeremy Insko were charged earlier this year with crimes related to theft from vehicles in Flemingsburg. Ishmael was charged with receiving stolen property U/500 dollars, a Class A misdemeanor, and Insko was charged with Theft by Unlawful Taking (from vehicle) a Class A misdemeanor.



Medal of Honor Recipient Hershel "Woody" Williams

Military Adventure Camp was proud to welcome United States Marine, Chief Warrant Officer 4 Hershel Woodrow "Woody" Williams as its keynote speaker for their 24 June Basic Cadet Training One Graduation. Chief Williams received the Medal of Honor for his actions in the Battle of Iwo Jima during World War II. The Medal of Honor is America's highest and most prestigious personal military decoration that is awarded to recognize U.S. military service members who distinguished themselves by acts of valor. The medal is normally awarded by the President of the United States in the name of the U.S. Congress. President Harry Truman presented Chief Williams with his medal.

surviving recipient of the Medal of Honor from that Battle of Iwo Jima . On the day that the flag was raised on Iwo Jima's Mt. Suribachi by Fleming County's own Franklin Sousley and five other Marines, Williams' unit was bogged down in a heavily fortified area. Williams, with the aid of cover fire from only four Marines, used a flamethrower to attack enemy machine gun pillboxes. After destroying several Japanese positions, he opened a gap in the Japanese defenses which enabled the Marines to move
